4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5	SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 26.1-36 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
6	and enacted as follows:
7	Out-of-pocket expenses - Health care services.
8	1. As used in this section:
9	a. "Cost sharing" means any coinsurance or deductible under a policy.
10	<u>b.</u> <u>"Enrollee" means an individual entitled to health care services under a policy.</u>
11	c. "Health care services" means items or services furnished to an enrollee for the
12	purpose of preventing, alleviating, curing, or healing human illness, injury, or
13	physical disability.
14	d. "Policy" means an accident and health insurance policy, contract, or evidence of
15	coverage on a group, individual, blanket, franchise, or association basis.
16	2. To the extent permitted by federal law and regulation, an insurer may not deliver,
17	issue, execute, or renew a policy that provides health care services coverage unless
18	that policy provides when calculating an enrollee's overall contribution to any
19	out-of-pocket maximum or any cost-sharing requirement under the policy, the
20	calculation must include any amount paid by the enrollee or paid on behalf of the
21	enrollee by another person.

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Dakota patients' out-of-pocket costs, medications adherence, and health care systems costs and impacts. The study shall assess health benefit participants' usage and prevalence of third-party payments in North Dakota. The study shall also review data from states with accumulator adjustment program bans since 2019 and shall seek input from all relevant stakeholders in the health care industry. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any proposed legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-ninth legislative assembly.
