- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-18.2-05 and 15.1-18.2-06 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to the expansion of the teacher support program to include
- 3 support for teachers in their second, third, and fourth years of teaching; and to provide an
- 4 appropriation.

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## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-18.2-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 8 15.1-18.2-05. Teacher support program Establishment.
- 9 The education standards and practices board shall:
- 10 1. Establish and administer a teacher support program;
- 2. Employ an individual to serve as a <u>first-year</u>beginning teacher support program
  coordinator;
- $\frac{3}{3}$  who shall:
  - Select and train experienced teachers who will serve as mentors for first-yearbeginning teachers and assist the first-yearbeginning teachers with instructional skills development; or
  - b. If a school district or other employing entity listed in section 15.1-18.2-07 is not in need of mentors for its <u>first-yearbeginning</u> teachers, select and train experienced teachers who will work with school district administrators and administrators from the other employing entities to identify the needs of the non-first-year teachers and help the non-first-year teachers address their particular needs through the use of:
  - (1) Research-validated interventions; and

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1		(3) Instructional coaching strategies.
2	<u>3.</u>	Employ an individual staff to serve as a two- to four-year support the teacher support
3		program coordinator who shall who will work with school administrators to select and
4		train experienced teachers who will serve as mentors for a cohort of teachers in their
5	1	second, third, or fourth year of teaching. A teacher mentor shall facilitate support
6		through monthlyregular sessions and other communication. The cohorts of teachers
7		mustmay include role-alike educators who may be from different schools and districts.
8	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-18.2-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is
9	amende	d and reenacted as follows:
10	15.1	-18.2-06. Teacher support program - Availability of services.
11	<u>1.</u>	The education standards and practices board may use any moneys it receives for the
12		teacher support program to provide staff compensation, training, evaluation, and
13		stipends for mentors and experienced teachers who assist first-year and non-first-year
14		teachers participating in the programserve under subsection 2 of section 15.1-18.2-05,
15		and to pay for any other administrative expenses resulting from the program; provided,
16		however, that the board may not expend more than five percent of the moneys for
17		administrative purposes.
18	<u>2.</u>	Subject to legislative appropriations, the education standards and practices board
19	ı	shall provide compensation to:
20		a. Up to fifty mentors Wentors who serve under subsection 3 of section 15.1-18.2-05
21		a sum of one thousand dollars per academic year; and
22		b. A coordinatorStaff employed under subsection 3 of section 15.1-18.2-05 a sum
23		approved by the education standards and practices board, not exceeding one
24		hundred thousand dollars per year for salary and benefits.
25	SEC	CTION 3. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION - TEACHER
26	SUPPO	RT PROGRAM. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the
27	state tre	asury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$300,000, or so much of the sum as may
28	be nece	ssary, to the department of public instruction for the purpose of providing funding to the
29	education standards and practices board to compensate up to fifty mentors and one program	

coordinatorstaff providing support for teachers in their second, third, and fourth years of

teaching, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025.
