- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-06 and a new section to
- 2 chapter 54-44.4 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to contracts with companies that
- 3 boycott Israel and a prohibition on investments.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 54-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Investments - Prohibition - Israel boycott.

- 1. As used in this section "boycott Israel" means engaging in refusals to deal, terminating business activities, or other similar commercial actions intended to limit commercial relations with persons doing business in Israel or in Israeli-controlled territories when the actions are taken:
 - a. In compliance or adherence to calls for a boycott of Israel, other than those boycotts under Public Law No. 96-72 [50 U.S.C. 2407(c)]; or
 - b. In a manner that discriminates on the basis of nationality, national origin, or religion.
 - 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the state may not adopt any investment policy that would have the effect of requiring or inducing any person to boycott Israel.
- 3. If the state receives evidence that a company boycotts Israel, the state shall determine whether the company boycotts Israel. If accompanied by the conduct described under subsection 1, a company statement that indicates the company is participating in a boycott of Israel or has taken boycott action at the request, in compliance with, or in furtherance of calls for a boycott of Israel, may be considered as one type of evidence that the company is participating in a boycott of Israel. An expressive activity, alone,

- 3 4. This section does not apply to:
 - a. A contract with a value of less than one hundred thousand dollars; or
- 5 <u>b. A contract with a company that has fewer than ten full-time employees.</u>
