- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15-19-00.1, 15-19-01, 15-19-02, 15-19-06,
- 2 15-19-08, and 15-20.1-03, and 15.1-02-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the
- 3 administration of the center for distance education.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15-19-00.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7 15-19-00.1. Definitions.

- 8 In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:
- 9 "Administration" includes the leadership of the center for distance education. 1.
- 10 2.—"Board" means the state board for career and technical education board of public 11 school education.
- 12 <u>3.2.</u> "Center" means the North Dakota center for distance education.
- 13 4.3. "DirectorSuperintendent" means the director and executive officer of the department of 14 career and technical educationsuperintendent of public instruction of the center for 15
 - distance education.

16 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15-19-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

17 amended and reenacted as follows:

18 15-19-01. North Dakota center for distance education courses - Establishment -

- 19 Enrollment of students - Courses of instruction.
- 20 The state shall provide kindergarten through grade twelve courses, comprehensive
- 21 educational support, and high school diplomas through the center for distance education under
- 22 the following provisions:

15	SEC	CTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 15-19-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
16	amende	d and reenacted as follows:	
17	15-1	19-02. Administration Center for distance education - Appointment and duties.	
18	The	program of and all activities related to the center for distance education are the	
19	responsibility of the director of the center for distance education and under the authority of the		
20	state board for career and technical educationsuperintendent. The director of the department of		
21	career and technical educationsuperintendent shall hire administration and staff for the center-		
22	for distance education of public instruction and the board. The director is appointed by and		
23	reports to the superintendent of public instruction. The center must have a separate budget and		
24	<u>a separa</u>	ate staff from the department of public instruction who must be classified under the state	
25	personn	el merit system. The administration of the center <u>director</u> shall carry out the	
26	responsibilities in operating the center for distance education in the manner approved by the		
27	state board for career and technical education, under the supervision of the director of the		
28	department of career and technical educationsuperintendent of public instruction, and compliant		
29	with requirements established by the superintendent of public instruction and the education		
30	standards and practices board for public school administrators and teachers. The state board		

- 1 for career and technical educationsuperintendent shall administer the responsibilities of the 2 board of a school district relating to the center for distance education. 3 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 15-19-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is 4 amended and reenacted as follows: 5 15-19-06. Special funds - Deposit of collections - Transfers from general fund 6 appropriations. 7 A special operating fund for the center for distance education must be maintained 1. 8 within the state treasury and all income and fees collected by the center for distance 9 education from any source must be remitted monthly by the directorsuperintendent of 10 public instruction to the state treasurer and credited to the special operating fund. All 11 expenditures from the fund must be within the limits of legislative appropriations and 12 must be made upon vouchers, signed and approved by the director. Upon approval of 13 the vouchers by the office of the budget, warrant-checks must be prepared by the 14 office of management and budget. 15 2. The state board for career and technical educationsuperintendent of public instruction
- 16 may establish an endowment and scholarship fund to provide financial grants to 17 students enrolled in courses offered through the center for distance education. The 18 endowment and scholarship fund may consist only of those funds specifically 19 appropriated by the legislative assembly and property received by the center for 20 distance education as a gift, devise, or bequest. Any gift, devise, or bequest of 21 property received by the center for distance education which is designated by the state-22 board for career and technical educationsuperintendent of public instruction and donor 23 for the endowment and scholarship fund must be deposited in the scholarship fund at 24 the Bank of North Dakota. The center for distance education may draw on the 25 endowment and scholarship fund for the award of endowments and scholarships 26 within the limits and rules adopted by the state board for career and technical-27 educationsuperintendent of public instruction.

SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 15-19-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

7	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 15-20.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is

9		purposes under its own direction and control, and to establish and control, by general	
10		regulations, the qualifications to be possessed by persons engaged in the training of	
11		career and technical education teachers.

19	amende	d and reenacted as follows:

5 Shall facilitate a process to review and update annually the statewide prekindergarten 6 through grade twelve education strategic vision. The process must include input and 7 participation from a steering committee that includes representatives of all state-level 8 entities receiving state education funding and education stakeholder groups. Each 9 steering committee member entity receiving state education funds shall provide-10 components of the entity's strategic plan which are aligned to the statewide strategic-11 vision. The steering committee shall prepare a collaborative report of the strategic 12 plans of each committee member entity receiving state education funds. The 13 superintendent shall provide the collaborative report and any updates to the strategic 14 vision to the legislative management during each interim and to a joint meeting of the 15 education standing committees during each regular legislative session.

Shall collaborate with workforce development stakeholders and the kindergarten 24 through grade twelve education coordination council to determine how best to 25 integrate computer science and cybersecurity into elementary, middle, and high school 26 curriculum under sections 15.1-21-01 and 15.1-21-02. Before September 1, 2022, the 27 superintendent shall provide a report to the legislative management regarding the 28 outcome of this collaboration.
