A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Management to consider studying the environmental impacts of oil, hydraulic fracturing sand, and hydraulic fracturing wastewater spills on water quality, vegetation, soil, and all species of domestic and wild animals, including insects, along State Highways 22, 23, and 37 within the exterior boundaries of the Fort Berthold Reservation.

WHEREAS, oil, hydraulic fracturing sand, and hydraulic fracturing wastewater spills have occurred along State Highways 22, 23, and 37 within the exterior boundaries of the Fort Berthold Reservation; and

WHEREAS, oil, hydraulic fracturing sand, and hydraulic fracturing wastewater spills may result in soil, surface water, and ground water contamination, which may have a negative impact on water quality, vegetation, soil, and animals; and

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest to review potential environmental impacts associated with oil, hydraulic fracturing sand, and hydraulic fracturing wastewater spills along State Highways 22, 23, and 37 within the exterior boundaries of the Fort Berthold Reservation;

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Legislative Management consider studying the environmental impacts of oil, hydraulic fracturing sand, and hydraulic fracturing wastewater spills on water quality, vegetation, soil, and all species of domestic and wild animals, including insects, along State Highways 22, 23, and 37 within the exterior boundaries of the Fort Berthold Reservation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Management report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the Sixty-ninth Legislative Assembly.
