REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE SATROM

MR. SPEAKER: Thank you Mr Speaker and members of the assembly

60 years ago, the United States Supreme Court issued an opinion recognizing the accused's right to counsel in a criminal matter. When an individual is charged with a crime, the United States Constitution requires the state to provide lawyers to those who would otherwise not be able to afford it. There is also a constitutional right to counsel for juveniles alleged to have committed a delinquent act in 1967.

North Dakota meets these constitutional mandates through the North Dakota Commission on Legal Counsel for Indigents. The Commission is the state agency that provides services to individuals when there is a constitutional, statutory or rule based right to counsel.

Mr. Speaker and members, please join me in recognizing the dedication and effort of the North Dakota Commission on Legal Counsel's Lawyers, staff and contract attorneys who provide this important service in the great state of North Dakota. We say in the pledge of allegiance at the start of every floor session "Justice for All", the men and women of the Commission help to make this a reality in North Dakota.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 57-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Natural gas pipeline infrastructure to underserved communities - Exception.

All property, excluding the land on which it is situated, which is part of an intrastate natural gas transportation or distribution pipeline system is exempt from taxation for a period of fifteen years following the taxable year in which the pipeline becomes operational. The exemption under this section applies if:

- 1. Construction of the pipeline commences after January 1, 2023.
- 2. The pipeline provides service to a city or township located within the state in which the majority of households or businesses did not have access to natural gas service as of January 1, 2023.
- <u>3.</u> The pipeline is located within this state.

SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act is effective for taxable years beginning after December 31, 2022."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. Section 24-02-45.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

24-02-45.4. Reimbursable federal electric vehicle infrastructure grants -Agreements with public or private entities for the administration of federal aid programs - Report.

- 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law but subject to legislative appropriation, the director may enter agreements and may accept any federal or other public or private funds for the administration of reimbursable electric vehicle charging grant programs. The director may enter an agreement with any person for the administration, approval, and inspection of a project to be constructed by a public or private entity. The cost-share for any project may consist only of federal, public, political subdivision, or private funding. Any federal formula funding for reimbursement grants must be at least ten percent of the cost-share for a project, but may not exceed eighty percent. The director may establish criteria for the grants and determine a reasonable grant reimbursement cost-share or limit for the project in accordance with federal aid provisions.
