House Bill 1074 was submitted by the North Dakota Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners to correct certain errors and inaccuracies in Section 43-29 of the North Dakota Century Code, the Veterinary Medical Practice Act. These changes are all "housekeeping" in nature. For the record, I will summarize each of the changes below.

The deletion of the words "American veterinary medical association" from lines 8 and 9 on page one was done to allow for the possibility that the Educational Commission for Foreign Veterinary Graduates will be administered by someone other than the American Veterinary Medical Association in the future. Discussions to accomplish such a change are underway at this time. The certificates mentioned in this section are issued by the Educational Commission for Foreign Veterinary Graduates.

The change of the word "Any" to the word "A" in line 14 on page 1 was made by the Legislative Council for consistency in style.

The change of "licensee" to "license" in line 24 on page 1 corrects a typographical error.

The change of "of at least seventy percent" to "approved by the board" in lines 7 and 8 on page two reflects the way the Veterinary Technician National Examination is scored. Scores for this examination, which is the examination used by the Board for licensing veterinary technicians in North Dakota, are not reported on a percent basis. The change gives the Board the authority to approve its own passing score. The Board presently uses the national passing score recommended by the test provider.

The deletion of the words "by the professional examination service" in lines 11 and 12 on page two allow for the future possibility that scores from the Veterinary Technician National Examination may be reported by someone other than the Professional Examination Service, the present test vendor. The name of the vendor for the examination should not be included in the practice act.

The change of "of veterinary medical examiners" to "examination committee" in lines 24 and 25 on page two was done to indicate the correct name of the organization responsible for the national licensing examination program in veterinary medicine. The National Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners became the National Board Examination Committee in 1980.
