<u>Minutes</u>: Some of the individuals testifying submit written testimony. When note please refer to it for more detailed information.

Representative Klein, Chairman of the GVA Committee opened the hearing on January 21, 1999.

Summary of the Resolution: Directing the legislative council to sturdy state agency office space needs to determine the feasibility and desirability of transferring state agencies or state employees to rural areas.

Testimony in Favor:

Representative Sveen, Appeared before the committee to introduce the resolution. The smaller towns are worried about their way of life. There is a lot of departments in the Capitol and Bismarck that maybe could be located elsewhere. With today's computer and technology things can be handled in the small towns, especially ones with hospitals. I think 2 or 4 years ago the

police academy, Devils Lake wanted it and we gave it to Bismarck. I think that was a mistake. I wish you would pass this.

Representative Klein, The area that your covering has been an area that is near and dear to my heart for a long time. No question the time has come. We just had a bill in IBL where they want to buy the building that workers comp. is in and the price is staggering.

<u>Representative Klemin</u>, Being from Bismarck, were you are proposing to turn all of our offices into empty buildings. What about the economic effects here?

Sveen, I am not talking about every little city in ND, just a few here and there.

Jim Heinrich, County Treasure/McIntosh of Ashley representing the ND County Treasures Association and we are in favor of this. We feel we could save the state some money and also provide a service to the rural areas of ND. Every county has a court house and the people available to do this work. Some of the rural areas have an aging population and it's tough for them to drive back and forth to do their business, this would really help them out. We would even be interested in doing this on a trial basis. Now the state pays up to 12 dollars/square foot to have some of these agencies farmed out across the state.

<u>Dave Koland</u>, ND Rural Water Association supports this study. This is very possible in the electronic age that we now live in. A million square feet of office space is being leased/rented in Bismarck by the state. No one is contemplating moving all this space to a rural area. Adding 5 people to the population of these 12 communities is equal to loosing 40 people in a large city. Many of these communities are loosing their infrastructure and their people.

Representative Klein, Closed the hearing on HCR 3011.

Representative Fairfield, Seconded the motion.

<u>Representative Klemin</u>, The problem here would be very detrimental to the Bismarck area and disrupting peoples lives. People would have to travel many miles to these areas.

Representative Fairfield, It would be nice if somebody had to drive our direction once in awhile to do business. Peoples lives in the rural areas have been disrupted also, I know I live there.

<u>Representative Metcalf</u>, I don't know how this study will come out, but we all know government is expanding and why does it have to expand in Bismarck.
