Minutes:

SENATOR FISCHER opened the hearing on HCR3018: A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION TO CREATE AND ENACT A NEW SECTION TO ARTICLE I OF THE CONSTITUTION OF NORTH DAKOTA, RELATING TO THE RIGHT TO HUNT AND FISH.

REP. BELTER introduced the bill at the request of a wildlife group interested in preserving the right to hunt, fish and trap in ND. There are cases throughout the nation where various groups are making movements to take away these rights, so ND needs to be on the forefront.

SENATOR REDLIN asked who is threatening this.

REP. BELTER replied ND has not been challenged but because other states have been challenged, this is a preemptive measure which the people want to take in the event this could happen.

SENATOR REDLIN asked are you referring to people who sell privileges to hunt and would that take it away

REP. BELTER replied no it would be animal rights groups, humane society and anti-hunting groups who could start an initiative measure.

SENATOR HEITKAMP asked would an initiated measure stop animal rights groups.

REP. BELTER replied we have an opportunity for the people in ND to through their vote express their feelings on what they want preserved in the constitution, and it doesn't mean this could not be challenged.

SENATOR REDLIN asked are you concerned about bills that constantly show up that say the land is automatically closed unless you get permission. Would this bill help with the argument to quell that approach.

REP. BELTER replied this bill is not meant to be in conflict with property rights. Landowners should have their property rights and the passage of this resolution should not infringe upon the property rights of the landowners.

REP. CARLSON stated this bill preserves the heritage of hunting, fishing and trapping for years to come, and it is about sound wildlife management and enforcement of ethical hunting behavior.

A DO PASS was urged.

SENATOR HEITKAMP asked if this bill was drafted similar to other states and have other states' measures stood up to the tests in the courts.

REP. CARLSON yes and most of them have stood to the challenges and most are fairly new.

SENATOR CHRISTMANN asked the words "by law and regulation", do you find these words important.

REP. CARLSON replied they are crucial words because they relate to what is on the books.

PAUL CRARY, Cass County Wildlife Club testified in support of HCR3018.

SENATOR HEITKAMP asked are you opening up a fight over something that you are not being denied rights to now.

PAUL CRARY replied no, but if we don't speak to this issue while in ND we can still have these privileges and rights, we may be too late later on if we don't do this now.

DEAN HILDEBRAND, ND Game and Fish Dept. testified in support of HCR3018 and urged a DO PASS. (See attached testimony).

MIKE DONAHUE, ND Wildlife Federation testified in support of HCR3018 and recommended a DO PASS.

SENATOR FISCHER closed the hearing on HCR3018.

COMMITTEE DISCUSSION: March 12, 1999, Tape 1, Side A, Meter# 915-1225: Senator Traynor will provide the committee with a memo prepared by the Attorney General which will be discussed at a later date.

COMMITTEE DISCUSSION: March 18, 1999, Tape 1, Side B, Meter# 455-900: Senator Traynor distributed material to the committee to consider. Action was deferred until a later date.

COMMITTEE DISCUSSION: March 25, 1999, Tape 1, Side A, Meter# 1140-4000 and Tape 1, Side B, Meter 0-740: Senator Traynor opened the discussion. SENATOR CHRISTMANN stated if we want to assure ourselves of a fight, pass it without the word

trapping in the amendments and then there will be a fight as there is a struggle to let the courts decide whether trapping is included in the taking of game. If we want to avoid a fight and protect the tradition of trapping, let's include it in there a make it known. Why the house specifically added trapping was with all the different types of taking of game, you will find animal rights groups who are opposed to any types of taking of game and fish, and I think trapping is the first in the pecking order and the easiest to criticize.

SENATOR TRAYNOR stated we need to consider amendments: On line 2, whether there should be another word besides "right", along with Senator Redlin's suggestion whether there should be something about the "protection of the resource": Under the Statement of Intent, perhaps as suggested by the Attorney General, that assures us that the authority is maintained in the Legislative area and in the department to manage the resource: and if the committee feels that "trapping" should be removed, we can discuss that, but I don't think we need an amendment for trapping. With this resolution, we want to have the best product we can when it comes out of here and the one that will serve the purpose of giving us protection against those that want to attack the hunters and fisherman for taking game and fish. Senator Traynor closed the hearing and discussion will be held at a later date.

COMMITTEE DISCUSSION: March 29, 1999, Tape 1, Side A, Meter# 0-885: SENATOR TRAYNOR opened the committee discussion to HCR3018. Three proposed amendments were prepared by the Legislative Council staff which were discussed. (See attached amendments) Senator Heitkamp stated we get this into the article of the constitution that we want it, if they want it to be there, and we make sure that the legislative branch is the one looking at making the rules in regards to it. It does what we were talking about. Senator Heitkamp moved to adopt

amendments 93050.0202 and 93050.0203, seconded by Senator Fischer. Senator Traynor stated Article I is the Declaration of Rights and Article XI is entitled General Provisions so we would move it into the General Provisions. If it is in with the rights, that might give the judiciary more authority than we would really want to give them to regulate the money sufficiently. This was recommended by the Ass't. Attorney General to the Game and Fish Dept. and the director of Game and Fish likes the idea of moving it to the General Provisions.

93050.0202: Roll was called on the motion to adopt amendment 93050.0202 with 4 YEAS, 1 NAY, 1 Absent and not voting.

Senator Heitkamp asked do we need amendment 93050.0203, because the meaning is the same as 93050.0202. Senator Heitkamp withdrew his motion to adopt amendment 93050.0203, along with Senator Fischer for his second to the motion. Senator Traynor closed the meeting and deferred action until a later date and time.

COMMITTEE ACTION: March 31, 1999, Tape 1, Side A, Meter# 0-740: Senator Traynor opened the committee hearing on HCR3018. Roll call indicated all committee members present. The March 29 committee discussion included a MOTION TO ADOPT AMENDMENT 93050.0202. Senator Traynor provided the committee with Minnesota amendments which were adopted by the Minnesota Legislature and approved by the people which does not include trapping. (See attached) SENATOR CHRISTMANN moved for a DO PASS AS AMENDED, seconded by SENATOR FISCHER. Roll call vote indicated 6 YEAS, 0 NAYS, 0 Absent and not voting. SENATOR TRAYNOR volunteered to carry the bill.

NORTH DAKOTA GAME AND FISH TESTIMONY HCR NO. 3018 SENATE NATURAL RESOURCE COMMITTEE FEBRUARY 11, 1999

The North Dakota Game and Fish Department supports HCR 3018. Nearly every family in North Dakota has at least one member who has engaged in hunting, fishing, or trapping or has benefited by these activities. These activities are part of our past, present, and hopefully our future heritage.

The earliest explorers and non native occupants of the area which is now North Dakota were not drawn to this area out of wander lust, the search for valuable minerals, or even agricultural pursuits. They were drawn here by the areas rich fur resources. In fact trapping and the fur trade were this states first industry. Hunting, fishing, and trapping have evolved from an unregulated and in numerous instances, an exploitative use of a natural resource, to it present form of regulated recreation and utilization of a renewable natural resource. Hunting, fishing and trapping related activities continue to be an important part of this states heritage and economy.

The Constitutional amendment proposed in HCR 3018 seeks to preserve and protect that heritage for future generations. The Department believes that as this amendment is written, it also intends to preserve the heritage of sound wildlife management through regulation; the enforcement of ethical sporting behavior; and the regulated and managed consumptive use of a renewable natural resource. There is a small minority of individuals who continue to advocate "Animal Rights", maybe it's time to advocate "Human Rights" for our culture and heritage. With these facts in mind, we urge a **DO PASS** on HCR 3018.
