HCR 3081 Study the feasibility and desirability of requiring insurance coverage of periodic physical examinations.

Rep. Sally Sandvig, introduced and testified in support of the bill. There can be a cost savings by following the plan within the bill.

<u>Johnson</u> asked about the increased costs being affordable and how many insurance companies cover this cost now.

Rose said Blue Cross and Blue Shield has about 70% of insurance in the state.

The committee went on to discuss areas of coverage by present insurance companies.

Rose said at times deductibles are used to pay for certain examination costs. She additionally said people in general don't get physical examinations unless they are having health problems.

Rod Larson, Blue Cross Blue Shies Insurance, testified in support of the bill

<u>Froseth</u> said the main point in this bill is education in that people will realize its important and its not just the cost aspect.
