JIM SMITH, Legislative Council, testified I was a staff person for the interim committee on human services which recommended this resolution. The committee looked at the administrative structure of the department of human services. The Legislative Council report is summarized on pages 79-84. The Virginia based consultant developed recommendations that will allow the Department of Human Services to be effective, responsive, and efficient for years to come. Some of the recommendations made by consultant that would improve the department are to add several divisions within the department, i.e., budget planning and evaluation division; and to have an ombudsman troubleshooter position, and information resource management unit. The resolution encourages the department to make some of these changes during the coming interim and report to the committee of the Legislative Council on their progress. That committee will report back to the next legislature.

mentioned on page 1? JIM SMITH stated the committee learned midsummer that the department is going through a strategic business planning process. It is summarized in the report.

KEVIN IVERSON, Department of Human Services, testified I do not have any prepared testimony but I am here to answer any questions in regards to the resolution as to what the department is doing currently in addressing the suggestions or recommendations in the study. We went through the strategic planning process this summer. The outline is prepared. There have been some changes made in the organizational structure of the department that would assist the executive director in managing the span of control. We recently hired a director of economic assistance who will oversee the medical eligibility functions, food stamps, and TANF or TEEM eligibility functions. The individual will come on board April 1, 1999.

Rep. CAROL NIEMEIER asked is a business plan being done at the present time, as you

Rep. CAROL NIEMEIER asked on the suggestion for reorganization, how will that impact the budget? KEVIN IVERSON said the changes either have been considered in the budget request or they will have no impact. If there is an unforeseen situation, we will have to appear before the Emergency Commission.

Rep. CHET POLLERT stated on pages two and three and part eight, it creates an assistant director position and a troubleshooter position and further asked has some other FTE's been eliminated if there is no additional cost? KEVIN IVERSON stated the economic assistance director position was created with an FTE position that was currently available. As for the positions mentioned in part eight, those have not been addressed yet. We have not requested additional FTE's, so we would maybe shift duties. We have a consolidation within the information management division which takes care of our technological requirements.

Rep. TODD PORTER asked is the department looking at setting up an appeals process similar to what HIT was set up for Medicare? KEVIN IVERSON stated I cannot answer that. I will have the Medicaid Director respond.

Rep. CLARA SUE PRICE asked in the strategic planning process, have you eliminated or highlighted any of the 18, e.g. yes, we are going to do these or no, we are not going to do these? KEVIN IVERSON stated there are several that we have accomplished already. As far as any that we have highlighted or do not plan to do, or cannot do, that hasn't been brought to my attention. I don't know what the plans of the executive director are in that respect. I know she has seriously considered all of them. Rep. CLARA SUE PRICE asked was it the intention of the committee that the recommendations may all be considered but not necessarily all would be implemented? KEVIN IVERSON stated some of the consideration would be, is it feasible both financially and logistically to bring about those types of changes. It order to bring it about, that would require additional FTE's and we wouldn't have those in our budget. That would be a barrier to completing that particular function or task.
