SCR4005 is to study the state of law and technology with respect to legislative redistricting.

SENATOR STENEHJEM opened the hearing on SCR4005 at 10:35 A.M.

All were present.

JAY BURINGRUD, Assistant Director of the Legislative Counsel, testified in favor of SCR4005. There was an Interim Study Committee Review for legislative redistricting after the 2001 session. Census figures are available in March, 2001. This resolution would provide for a Legislative Counsel study of the state of the law and technology with respect to legislative redistricting. The Legislative Counsel study would review Constitutional and statutory provisions governing legislative redistricting, review federal court decisions governing legislative redistricting, review types of computer programs and software available to assist in developing legislative redistricting plans. Legislative Assembly in bill form in 2001 the number of legislative districts and any new redistricting plans. The allowable population deviation and set perimeters for legislative redistricting. Whether district boundaries should float with political subdivisions. The counties and townships don't float, but cities do. This is to set perimeters for any committee that will be looking at developing of legislative redistricting plan probably a committee would be appointed after the 2001 session to develop a plan and possibly a special session in October, 2001 to consider the legislative redistricting plan so it could be in place for the 2002 elections. Almost exactly the same as the resolution approved by the 1989 Legislative Assembly. This is to prepare plans for redistricting activities in 2001.

SENATOR NELSON asked if there will be any major redistricting.

JAY BURINGRUD stated this is mainly for minority representation. We don't know if this will apply to North Dakota.

SENATOR NELSON asked if the Chippawa are meeting the base number.

JAY BURINGRUD stated that they may be getting close.

SENATOR BERCIER stated that the census has a large discrepancy. The census shows 6000, we estimate that there is maybe 11,000. We are taking some steps to get a better census. SENATOR STENEHJEM CLOSED the hearing on SCR4005.

SENATOR NELSON made a motion for DO PASS, seconded by SENATOR WATNE.
