Minutes:

The committee was called to order. Roll call was taken and all senators were present.

The hearing on SCR4045 was opened.

SENATOR ST. AUBYN, sponsor of the bill gave us a history of resolution. Private providers have brought concerns related to funding and other issues. Corrections to the budget or adjustments to the budget was one of the issues. They would like to consolidate some duplications, like audits. We need to take some time to study how other states are handling these private provider systems and make some recommendations for the future such as funding and many other issues. I urge committee to adopt this study. SENATOR LEE asked how does reimbursement for private providers compare with state employees doing the same work.

SENATOR ST. AUBYN replied that it was far lower than state employees. They asked for an 81 cents increase per hour for employees. We were able to provide 44 cents increase. Due to

financial constraints we couldn't do anything more with benefits. SENATOR THANE asked about the pilot project; where would it be established, would it be a project already in place and have an internal project for pilot project. SENATOR ST. AUBYN: It has not been identified, but probably where we have existing situations, we may incorporate this. SENATOR DEMERS asked if the monies are required to go to the raises and salaries. ST. AUBYN: The language doesn't explicitly state that and we haven't seen a problem in the last biennium. They have been shifting money to the employees where they have needed it.

SENATOR GRINDBERG, sponsor, Board member of two provider organizations - Wahpeton and Fargo. The association providers are in common agreement with how they should operate with the department. There is too much bureaucracy involved. They are audited on work 3-4 years in the past and then held accountable for those expenditures. This is not cost effectiveness does not make any sense. The state is contracting for services. Providers need to have flexibility; need to be able to work with the flow of the economy. State needs private providers; it is more cost effective than bringing it back to the state. SENATOR DEMERS stated that a court case dictated checks and balances. SENATOR LEE asked if it would be important to include in the resolution how the ARC lawsuit affected the oversight. SENATOR GRINDBERG agreed that it may indeed be helpful.

Hearing was closed on SCR4045.

In discussion SENATOR LEE suggested an additional Whereas to include these thoughts.

SENATOR DEMERS stated that it should be the 4th whereas. After deliberation between

SENATOR DEMERS and SENATOR LEE, they came up with "Whereas requirements resulting

from the ARC lawsuit may still exist, which may no longer be necessary in order to provide

Minutes:

Sen. ROD ST.AUBYN, District 43, testified that the study resulted from hearings held by the Senate appropriations committee. There seemed to be continuing comments on the difficulties in salaries and duplication of audits. The subcommittee didn't feel comfortable making changes to the procedures without investigating the repercussions. So this study was initiated to perform the study. In response to questions from Rep. TODD PORTER, Sen. ST.AUBYN pointed out that the providers conduct their own audits and are required by the Department of Human Services to have an additional independent audit to determine excluded and reimbursable costs. There are questions about this duplication. Also the state audits are delayed several years and reimbursement is not available until the audit is complete.

Sen. TONY GRINDBERG, District 41, testified that as a board member of one of the providers he is in full agreement with Sen. ST.AUBYN. The bureaucracy has become overwhelming for

the private provider. Audits can be 4 years old and the provider has to be accountable for the provisions of the audits. In addition the state should not be involved in the pay scales and daily operations of the contracted services. He hopes this study will help answer some of these questions.

There was no OPPOSITION to SCR4045.
