<u>Vice-Chr Kretschmar</u>: Could you just briefly outline what the State Bar is and what your duties are?

<u>Penny Miller</u>: the State Bar Board is charged with the examining of the lawyers fitness and moral character or what to be lawyers fitness and moral character. And we also license lawyers, but that

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is more of an administrative duty in that we just send the billing out to those who are eligible to be licensed and collect the fees. And then we pay those fees according to statute, some of the fees for disciplinary purposes and the rest we keep for the bar association for the examining licensing.

Chairman DeKrey: Any other questions, if not, thank you for appearing before the committee, we will hold the hearing open until 9:30 am as that is when it was scheduled.

<u>Chairman DeKrey</u>: We will reconvene on HB 1071. Is there anyone here in opposition of HB 1071? Does anyone want to entertain a motion on HB 1071?

Rep Delmore: Thank you Mister chairman, I would vote to a DO PASS on HB 1071.

Chairman DeKrey: A motion to have a DO PASS on HB 1071, and a second?

2001 TESTIMONY

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Summary of House Bill No. 1071

HB No. 1071 relates to changing the name of the State Bar Board to State Board of Law Examiners.

This proposed name change will more accurately reflect the primary role of the Board, which is examining the fitness and moral character to practice law, and will help alleviate the continued confusion between the Board and the State Bar Association. Additionally, the name change will make it easier for out-of-state attorneys and others to direct inquiries to the correct office, as the majority of other states use the Board of Law Examiner or Board of Bar Examiner designation.

Other proposed amendments are grammatical in nature and make the affected sections gender neutral.
