

North Dakota Securities Commissioner

March 14, 2001

SB2091 was introduced by the Securities Commissioner to reduce the regulatory burden on North Dakota businesses. This bill allows small businesses operating under a franchise agreement to transfer their franchise to a new owner, without obtaining the written approval of the Commissioner, as the law now requires.

SB2091 also provides a reasonable fifteen (15) day time limit for businesses to request a hearing regarding an enforcement order issued by the Commissioner, and provides that the Commissioner must hold a requested hearing within fifteen (15) days after receiving a request for hearing.
