

TESTIMONY FOR SENATE BILL NO. 2164

Senate Industry, Business, and Labor Committee

Testimony of Gary D. Preszler, Commissioner, Department of Banking and Financial Institutions in support of Senate Bill No. 2164.

Senate Bill No. 2164 changes the name of the Department of Banking and Financial Institutions to the Department of Financial Institutions by amending all state statute references to the Department's name.

The Department's name change is being proposed for three reasons:

1. The statutory definition of "financial institutions" already includes banks and therefore banking and financial institutions is somewhat redundant. Although the Department also supervises other entities that are not included in the statutory definition, "financial institutions" is commonly used to describe all entities engaged in financial activities.
2. The Department name sometimes causes public confusion with the Bank of North Dakota. Occasionally the Department receives telephone inquiries from the public mistakenly believing they are contacting the Bank of North Dakota.

3. A shorter Department name facilitates in the development of a Department logo. Work on development of a logo lead us to think about the name and whether it should be changed.

“Department of Financial Institutions” is commonly used by other states with “Department of Banking” or “Division of Banks (or Banking)” used more in cases where bank regulation is a part of a larger agency having other supervisory responsibilities such as check cashiers, mortgage lenders, or securities.

The Department of Banking and Financial Institutions’ name has been used since 1969. Prior to that time the Department was known as the State Examiner.

The Department stands in support of Senate Bill No. 2164 and requests a favorable “Do Pass” from the Committee.

Further, even several ND banks have removed the word "bank" from their name to reflect the new age of financial service providers.

"Department of Financial Institutions" is commonly used by other states with "Department of Banking" or "Division of Banks (or Banking)" used more in cases where bank regulation is a part of a larger agency having other supervisory responsibilities such as check cashiers, mortgage lenders, or securities.

The Department of Banking and Financial Institutions' name has been used since 1969. Prior to that time the Department was known as the State Examiner.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS

The Legislative Council asked that the bill be amended to grant authorization so that the Code Revisor will change any other legislation that is enacted by the Fifty-seventh Legislative Assembly to reflect the name, the "Department of Financial Institutions".

The Department stands in support of Senate Bill No. 2164 and requests a favorable "Do Pass" from the Committee.
