Minutes: Chairman Krebsbach called the committee back to order and opened the hearing on SB 2284 which relates to the uniform service dates for wartime veterans. Appearing before the committee to introduce the proposed legislation was Representative Lonnie Winrich, District 18, cosponsor of the bill. He indicated that Senator Berolter is the prime sponsor of this bill as well. Representative Winrich indicated he would like to lend his support to the passage of SB 2284. Dennis Boknecht, liaison between the veteran's legislative committee and the North Dakota Veteran's Coordinating Council. He presented written testimony to the committee. The hand out marked Appendix A was used for his presentation. It was felt that it would be best to simplify the bill so that there would not be a need to update the information it contains every session. Senator C.
