Minutes:

The meeting was called to order. All committee members present. Hearing was opened on SB 2440 relating to required employer records.

SENATOR D. MATHERN: Sponsor of the bill. This bill makes only one change to the existing law, it requires the employer to record actual hours worked by the employee. People are working more than eight hours a day and have to sign cards that record only 8 hours. This bill will not conflict with the existing administrative rules that allow rounding off of hours.

SENATOR MUTCH: What if hired by the month?

SENATOR D. MATHERN: Salaried exempt employees, this does not apply to them.

SENATOR KREBSBACH: The bill says "actual hours worked" what if they come in early and punch in.

SENATOR D. MATHERN: According to administrative rules time clocks are not required.

Employees who voluntarily stay late or come early do not have to be paid.

DINA BUTCHER, Deputy Commissioner of Labor, Neutral. This makes the point stronger, it is under law and covered by administrative rules that employers have to keep records of actual hours worked.

SENATOR KLEIN: Would employee have recourse with the Labor Commissioner without this bill?

D. BUTCHER: Yes.

SENATOR D. MATHERN: We are only adding three words : "actual hours worked" to the existing law.

Hearing concluded.

Committee reconvened. Tape 2-A-23.6 to 28.7. Discussion held.

SENATOR ESPEGARD: There is really nothing wrong with this bill, its already covered by law.

SENATOR ESPEGARD: Move: do pass. SENATOR KREBSBACH: Second.


