Minutes: Senator Watne opened the hearing on SB 2445: A BILL FOR AN ACT TO CREATE AND ENACT A NEW SECTION TO CHAPTER 19-03.1 OF THE NORTH DAKOTA CENTURY CODE, RELATING TO A COMPREHENSIVE STATUS AND TRENDS REPORT REGARDING UNLAWFUL CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE USE AND ABUSE TREATMENT AND ENFORCEMENT EFFORTS.

Wayne Stenehjem, Attorney General of ND, testifies in favor of SB 2445. (testimony attached/amendments)
