Hearing was opened on SCR 4040 to study the problems associated with credit card companies marketing credit cards to college students.

Senator Herb Urlacher, District 36, sponsor. Credit card debts are trapping students, most are bailed out by their parents which imposes financial hardships on most of them. We are asking the legislative council to study the situation.

Senator Espgaard: What would the legislative study target?

Sen. Urlacher: What is really happening: number of student that have cards, how far in debt they are, effect on the institution and students, institution fees paid by taxpayers.

Sen. Urlacher: Do not know. Will find out from study.



Chairman Berg: We'll close the hearing on SCR 4040.


