

Minutes: CHAIRMAN HOLMBERG opened the hearing to HB 1095. A bill relating to the veterans' home general fund appropriations expenditures.

(Meter 50) SHEILA PETERSON, Director of the Fiscal Management Division of OMB testified in support of this bill. See written testimony Exhibit 1.

(Meter 163) CHAIRMAN HOLMBERG stated that this is an original bill for Appropriations. It has to do with how dollars are moved around and not the fiscal impact.

(Meter 184) SENATOR KILZER asked how many dollars has this amounted to in each of the two or three past biennium. (Meter 198) SHEILA PETERSON stated she did not have the budget information right now but the upcoming biennium is approximately a 10 million dollar budget and a one-third split. One third federal funds, one third special funds and one third general funds and in the neighborhood of about 3 million dollars. General fund dollars that are appropriated directly to the veterans' home. Right now the law that is changing is many decades

# Testimony HB 1095 House Appropriations – Human Resources January 20, 2003

Good morning Mr. Chairman and members of the Human Resources Subcommittee of House Appropriations.

I'm Sheila Peterson, Director of the Fiscal Management Division of OMB.

Last Thursday you heard information on the performance audit of the Veterans Home. HB1095 corrects an issue that was included in an audit finding in that performance audit.

North Dakota Century Code requires that federal and special funds be spent before general fund dollars. This bill does not change that process. The Century Code also requires that at the point in time that the federal and special funds are spent, a transfer is to be made from the general fund to the special operating fund.

This bill amends that process so the Veterans Home would spend directly from the general fund – just like all other state agencies spend directly from the general fund.

The main reason we are suggesting this change is:

If general fund dollars were transferred to the special operating fund of the Home, those dollars would lose their identity as general fund dollars. If the Veterans Home is appropriated general fund dollars, we want them to be accounted for as such. We don't want the identity of the general fund dollars to be lost.
