Chairman Weisz opened the hearing on HB 1236. All Representatives were present.

HB 1236 relates to littering.

Rep. Meyer introduced the bill.

Rep. Meyer: This bill was introduced at the request of a wife of one of the commissioners in Stark County and basically she gets a lot of trash thrown in her ditches. And she has taken down the plates and asked the police or highway patrol to fine these people; there is right now a twenty dollar fine for littering. She is concerned about the fast food bags. When you read this in old language, it used to say, any substance likely to injure a person, animal or vehicle. The problem with law enforcement that if you have a McDonald's bag in the ditch, you would have to prove that it was likely to injure a person, animal or vehicle, which it would not do. He felt like this would just be a clarification in the law.

Chairman Weisz asked for further support, seeing none, he asked for opposition. There was no opposition. The hearing was closed. No action was taken at this time.

Minutes:

Senator Gary Lee opened the hearing on HB 1236 relating to littering.

Senator Shirley Meyer introduced the bill and testified in favor of it. The bill came to her through a county commissioner's wife who lives just outside of Dickinson. She has picked up garbage and contacted enforcement officers and they informed her that they couldn't enforce the fines for littering. There is a twenty dollar fine but one of the problems in code is that it had to be determined that litter had to be a substance likely to injure any person, animal or vehicle. She said a McDonald's sack isn't likely to injure anyone. In HB 1236 people can be picked up and given the twenty dollar fine for littering and it doesn't have to be determined to injure any person, animal or vehicle.

Senator Fiebiger asked if an apple is litter.

Senator Meyer said that she goes by the definition of her mother, "If the birds will eat it and the squirrel will eat it, it is o-kay." She said in their discussions, everything that was considered bio-degradable is considered not littering.

Senator Lee closed the hearing on HB 1236.

Senator Bakke moved for a Do Pass on HB 1236.

Senator Nething seconded the motion.
