Reconvened House Industry, Business, and Labor Committee.

Opened hearing on HB 1034.

Chairman Keiser: This bill came out of the healthcare reform review committee, established last session to study primarily the Affordable Care Act, its implementation, and its impact on North Dakota. As many of you recall, that committee monitored the Affordable Care Act, the rules and regulations that were being promulgated from the point of its passage until the end of our interim. This was a standing committee, and it is the only additional bill to come out the interim healthcare reform committee. Its purpose is very simple.

Chairman Keiser read lines 4-6 of the bill. The law is in effect since 2010, it is being implemented, effective October 1, 2013. At that time, healthcare exchanges will be operational in the sense that you can begin to explore the options that exist in the healthcare exchange. North Dakota is one of the states that has opted for the federal exchange. In theory, the federal exchange will be implemented at that time. However, there are still a great number of rules that are being developed that may provide an opportunity for the state of North Dakota to have input and decisions relative to its implementation. We felt very strongly that the legislature of the state of North Dakota should maintain an active role in any developments that are policy related, relative to a state position on the Affordable Care Act.

This law does require the Insurance Commissioner, the State Department of Health, and the Department of Human Services to continue to work with that committee during the next interim, should any changes be required. It's hard to say whether any significant changes shall be required or made available to the North Dakota legislature. Clearly, the law currently says that in 2017 states may opt out of the federal law and, at that point, implement a state-based program, providing that it meets the requirements established in the Affordable Care Act.

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Vice-Chair Sukut: Are there any questions for Representative Keiser?

Chairman Keiser: The staff for interim committee, Jennifer Clark, and she said she has nothing to add. Is there anyone who is here to testify in support of HB 1034? Is there anyone who is here to testify in opposition to HB 1034? Anyone to testify in a neutral position on HB 1034?
