Tag Anderson, Director of the Risk Management Division of OMB: Refer to written testimony, attachment 1

**Chairman Keiser:** How often were reports given? What, if any, was provided by giving the reports? What was positive by doing this?

**Tag Anderson:** The reporting to the budget section has been annual. We would give a short presentation providing the total potential available savings within the program. I have been doing it for three years, and there has never been a substantive question. That is what prompted us to support this bill. I have not problems doing the reporting.

Chairman Keiser: Does the budget section want it?

**Tag Anderson:** Anecdotally, I am not so sure they do. We were typically scheduled right before lunch, so maybe that's why they don't ask questions. With no questions, there are essentially no changes to the program. The underlying assumption is that the state pool of workers in the various rate classes can do better than the state as a whole, and that has proven to be true. Therefore, retaining \$100,000 deductible internally has proven to be cost effective for the state.

Chairman Keiser: Are we self-insured?

**Tag Anderson:** We are self-insured within a deductible layer. The bureau WSI continues to calculate the guaranteed cost premium. That is the premium which each agency would have been billed had there not been a consolidated account. Those monies are paid to the Risk Management Division and placed into the Risk Management Workers' Compensation

Fund, a separate fund. The monies are then expended out of that fund to pay our exposure within the deductible layer, which currently is \$100,000. In other words, we pay the first \$100,000 of any claim for any injured state worker. We also pay our excess premiums to WSI as well as the premiums under the \$100,000 deductible.



# Testimony on HB 1081 Tag Anderson, Director OMB Risk Management Division January 14, 2013



Chairman Keiser, and members of the House Industry, Business and Labor Committee, my name is Tag Anderson. I am the Director of the Risk Management Division of OMB. I appear today in support of HB 1081.

NDCC 65-04-03.1 was enacted in 2001. This legislation established a single workers compensation account for all state agencies with authority to enter into large deductible contracts with Workforce Safety and Insurance. The initial legislation had a sunset clause, but as the program proved successful, the statute became permanent following the 2003 legislative session.

The single consolidated account for workers compensation coverage continues to be successful. The underlying assumptions that prompted the legislation have proven to be true and consistent over a long period of time. In addition, the Risk Management Division engages an independent actuary to review its unpaid liability exposure within the deductible layer. This assists the Division in making discount and dividend decisions which are designed to both encourage agencies to adopt proactive loss control practices and return cost savings to individual agencies. HB 1081 simply presents the question of whether continued reporting to the Budget Section of Legislative Management should remain given the lack of any significant change in the program since its inception.
