Minutes:

Ch. Nathe: We will open the hearing on HB 1229.

Rep. Lisa Meier: Sponsor, support; explained the bill. This bill pertains to Marketplace for Kids. It allows school districts, by approval, to request a CTE to pay directly for Marketplace for Kids, for the students that want to attend. It eliminates a non-necessary step in the administering of these grants.

Ch. Nathe: Thank you.

Wayne Kutzer, Director, Dept. of Career and Technical Education: Support (see attached).

Ch. Nathe: Can you give us an overview of what Marketplace for Kids does.

Wayne Kutzer: Marketplace for Kids holds 10 regional events across the state, listed on the back page of my testimony. They work on entrepreneurship concepts for students. It is much like a science fair. Students come and bring their projects. They develop something that they want to start a business with or a concept that they want to market. There are judges at each one of these events. There are 10,500 students that participate in Marketplace for Kids every year across the state. There are about 1100 projects that students bring in. During the event, students are either demonstrating projects and/or going to mini-sessions put on people in the community, whether it's talking about careers, entrepreneurship, IT, etc.

Rep. Rust: The only thing that I see as a negative, has to do with auditing. One of the requirements when you receive public funds there needs to be some oversight and that auditors need to do their job. Would this, in anyway, provide dollars to an organization such as Marketplace for Kids without proper auditing trails. Are they audited, who would do that, etc.

Wayne Kutzer: Marketplace for Kids is audited, and from an agency standpoint we are audited too in terms of the trail of dollars that go there.

Rep. Wall: Who originally determined the grade levels for Marketplace for Kids and why that grade emphasis.

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Wayne Kutzer: The grade level of 4, 5 and 6 has been with Marketplace for a long time. That's also the time when students start getting involved science fairs and science projects. It was an attempt to work with students very early on.

Ch. Nathe: Thank you. Further testimony in support. Testimony in opposition. We will close the hearing. What are the committee's wishes in regard to HB 1229.

Chairman Flakoll opened the hearing on HB 1229

Representative Lisa Meier, District 32: This is a really simple bill that will allow school districts by approval to request to CTE to pay directly for marketplace for kids. It eliminates a non-necessary step in administering these grants.

Chairman Flakoll: How many dollars are we talking for the grants?

Representative Lisa Meier I will allow the experts to let you know that. I think about \$250,000 a biennium.

Wayne Kutzer, Director of the Department of Career and Technical Education: I wish to testify in support of HB 1229. (Written testimony #1 attached)

Vice Chairman Schaible: Is there still a match?

Wayne Kutzer: Yes there is. The match is in the form of transportation costs. They can also use the cost of subs. They list all of the costs involved.

Chairman Flakoll: This is about \$250,000 total through this program?

Wayne Kutzer: That is correct.

Chairman Flakoll: Does this flow from the state to the schools or the schools to the state?

Wayne Kutzer: From the state to the schools.

Chairman Flakoll: Are the dollars from the program immune from the ending fund balance provisions? The 45% plus \$20,000.

Wayne Kutzer: I would say yes they are because they are really expenses. Any money we give to the schools have to pay marketplace for kids for the services so it is really an in and out from the school's perspective. That is why we are asking to just write the check to pay for the students if the school says so. It wouldn't have to go thought the accounting system at the schools.

Chairman Flakoll: When is Marketplace held?

Wayne Kutzer: Ten events across the state start next month and run through the middle of May.

Chairman Flakoll: So their money would come in sometime after May?

Wayne Kutzer: Correct. We try to pay the schools so they can pay Marketplace right after the event. Within a week of the event we get the information of how many students participated and that is how we determine the amount of dollars.

Senator Luick: How long has this program been in effect?

Wayne Kutzer: Marketplace has been taking place for 15-20 years but the funding has been there since 2007.

Senator Luick: The \$250,000 is this year's appropriation? What did they get last biennium and is there any of that money left?

Wayne Kutzer: It is a biennium appropriation and there is no money left over. We adjust the level through the number of students they have so all the funding goes to marketplace through kids.

Senator Luick: Shouldn't there be a fiscal not to this?

Wayne Kutzer: It is in our budget so it is a reoccurring dollar amount.

Chairman Flakoll: To be clear your budget number is?

Wayne Kutzer: SB 2019

Chairman Flakoll: Do they have carryover authority?

Wayne Kutzer: No we don't

House Education Committee Testimony on HB 1229

Mr. Chairman, members of the committee. MY name is Wayne Kutzer, Director of the Department of Career and Technical Education. HB 1229 is designed to help reduce extra fiscal work by school districts who participate in a Marketplace for Kids.

In the 2007 the Board of Marketplace for Kids approached the State Board for Career and Technical Education and legislature for funding to assist Marketplace for Kids in the delivery of their elementary entrepreneurship program they hold across the state. With our Boards permission, Marketplace requested that \$250,000 of funding authority be placed in our budget bill. The language that you see before you was placed in the bill during the legislative process.

We are requesting that the language be modified to allow our agency, with the permission of the participating school, to pay Marketplace for Kids directly. We have tried working through the schools, working through their REA, to be able to consolidate the number of checks and the extra work it involves but we feel this language will the make the process better. It will reduce the work for the local school and it will insure Marketplace for Kids a timely payment for services.

Currently schools fill out a form, sign it and return it to us listing the number of students who had projects, and identifying what they contributed for local match. The new language in this bill would enable us to have the school sign the form with a statement requesting that the funds go directly to Marketplace for Kids.

At the time of that bill I was aware of Marketplace for Kids and the great activities they made available to students, which is why we agreed to be part of that original request, now partially due to the funding that is provided to Marketplace through our agency I am on Marketplace for Kids Board.

Mr. Chairman and members of the committee I would ask for your support of HB 1229 and I would be glad to answer any questions that you may have.
