Jennifer Barry: Early Childhood Services Administrator for DHS testified in support of the bill. (See Testimony #1)

Rep. Oversen: The definition of family child care is not changing the number of children just when they can have that additional?

Barry: Currently, family child care providers can have the seven plus the two additional school age kids, but they can only have the school age kids during the school year and so this would allow them to have them during the summer.

Chairman Weisz: Is there a reason why you had to define what school age children were?

Barry: There was no definition of school age children and we have had questions in the past regarding this same provision when they could have the same school agers. We are defining it as a child five years or older.

Rep. Fehr: On page 4, line 24, what is the pursuit of self-declaration mean?

Barry: The smoking prohibition would apply to our licensed program, self-declared and our registered. A self-declared provider is an unlicensed provider caring for five or fewer children and a registered provider is someone who provides care in the child's home.

Rep. Fehr: I assumed self-declared meant they weren't licensed, but then I read at the end of the sentence, "subject to licensure" and now I am confused.

The passage of this bill would revise the definition of "family child care," add a definition of "school-age children," update the regulation on smoking based on new state law regarding smoking in public places, and update the provision of the Early Childhood Services Advisory Board.

Section 1 of the bill revises the definition of "family child care." Currently, family child care providers are allowed to care for seven children, of which no more than three may be under the age of 24 months, plus two additional school-age children before and after school and all day when school is not in session during the regular school year. This bill would remove the limits on when family child care providers could care for the additional school-age children.
