Chairman Weisz opened the hearing on HB 1037.

Jennifer Clark: From Legislative Council gave information on the bill. During the interim the committee received information on the cost sharing for the traditional Medicaid program. And we had discussion on Medicaid expansion. The State of Michigan had a detailed list of cost sharing so the individual on Medicaid expansion had out of pocket obligations. It was brought to the committee whether we should do that on our Medicaid expansion. DHS testified that under our traditional Medicaid program there is some out of pocket cost sharing going on, but it is relatively a small amount. It is not a sliding scale based on income. DHS testified that their IT system is not ready at this time to accommodate that detailed income based cost sharing. If we moved to that the Feds might reevaluate our program and say we can't do it. We need more information.

Jerry Jurena: President of the ND Hospital Association testified in support of the bill. We would like to see this study completed.

Jennifer Clark, Legislative Council, introduced HB 1037 to the Senate Human Services Committee and indicated this bill comes from the Health Aare Reform Interim Committee. This is going to the session law and good for the interim. It provides that the Department of Human Services during the interim will study options for implementing income based cost sharing provisions for traditional Medicaid and Medicaid expansion and report back by July 1, 2016. The background, there was a committee member who is specifically interested in something that the state of Michigan did with expansion program. They implemented some income based cost sharing provisions. Today the Department of Human Services has a cost sharing provision for traditional Medicaid, however it is not income based. Their computer system needs modifications if income based provisions are implemented. It also heightens the awareness at the federal level and CMS will evaluate whether it is appropriate.

Senator Warner asked if it was the MMIS software or eligibility system. **Jennifer Clark** stated the MMIS system, and Maggie Anderson (DHS) confirmed.

Senator Warner the word cost sharing, if we are talking about Medicaid expansion program and someone shares in the cost for the co-pay of a premium, isn't that eligibility piece versus MMIS.

Maggie Anderson (DHS) when this was discussed, it was both. When the department released the Request for Proposal (RFP) for the Health Plan, the department indicated that

they had to match the cost sharing in the Medicaid plan. This is considered nominal cost sharing. In Michigan, it was a deductible or co-insurance or helping pay part of the premium, so some may be on eligibility side, but the cost sharing for specific services is on the MMIS side. The cost sharing is detailed in the Medicaid state plan. To change this the state will need to come into compliance with the new cost sharing principles and rules which will look at individual's income, household income, 5% total their total income, and this gets managed in MMIS so you know when to apply the cost sharing. This would be a challenge.

Senator Warner cost sharing is synonymous with co-pay. Maggie Anderson (DHS) confirmed correct.

Senator Dever stated that the previous bill (HB 1036) had \$20,000 for the Department of Health - is the cost for this bill something you absorb in Department of Human Services?

Maggie Anderson (DHS) explained that it is her staff who are the experts and they would absorb the costs as part of their daily business. They would develop a report with options. We would also have to work with HHS-CMS to comply with federal requirements..
