It will most likely be given to a committee that is already formed and studying other issues. I am not sure where this one would go. It could go in Human Services or Health or whatever. There would not be any more need for resources unless the chairman of the committee would make a request to hire an outside consultant for additional information and then that would have to be approved by legislative management. So no it is not going to add additional cost to the body up front.
