Good Morning, Chairman Koppelman and esteemed members of the House Judiciary Committee.

For the record, I am Representative Bill Devlin of District 23.

I have introduced HB1422 on behalf of the Secretary of State's office.

Currently the law requires the Secretary of State to distribute copies of the North Dakota Administrative Code in electronic format to a number of agencies, offices, libraries, and officers for free and to others on a subscription basis. This is currently done using CD as the method of delivery. This bill would change it so that the SOS would only need to send email notification to the list of recipients that an update to the code had been published. That email would contain the link to where the update was found on Legislative Council's website and there would be no cost to anyone.

Changes in technology have made things easier and more efficient in a lot of areas of government and this is one of them.

The Secretary of State's Office will provide testimony detailing the need for this bill and answer every question the committee might have on this issue.

This bill will save approximately \$3,200 per biennium.

In section 28-32-20 of the Century Code, the Secretary of State is mandated to print and distribute the administrative code without charge to approximately 111 recipients listed in subsection 1 of the current law. This distribution is completed on a quarterly basis after new administrative rules have been reviewed by the Administrative Rules Committee.

Although listed in the law, some recipients have requested that they not be mailed a copy. Currently, there are approximately fifty some recipients. The reason for this is because the administrative code is online.

For example, the Rule Supplements are listed online (see Exhibit A) and the entire code is available, as well online (see Exhibit B).

With this bill, the Secretary of State's duty will be to send an electronic message when a new supplement has been posted to notify the recipients listed in the law and any person that requests to be so notified. The message will direct them to the pages where they can find the update, i.e., Exhibit A and B.

The agency no longer has any subscribers to receive printed copies of the administrative code (see page 2, deleted lines 8 through 13) and, as a result, there hasn't been any revenue for several years.

Currently, legislators according to N.D.C.C. § 54-03-24 are entitled to receive a printed copy of the supplement. No legislator has currently made that request. With the changes in Section 2, they will be entitled to receive an electronic message, if they so request.



Administrative Rules



The Legislative Council publishes the Administrative Code which is the codification of all rules of state administrative agencies, as that term is defined by North Dakota Century Code Section 28-32-02. Many state agencies are not administrative agencies as defined by Section 28-32-02. Although rules of those agencies are not required to be published in the Administrative Code, some agencies have consented to placing their rules in the code. Those agencies are identified with an explanatory note on the title page for that agency. The Administrative Code was initially published July 1, 1978. The Administrative Code is updated with quarterly changes. The Administrative Code is published in a CD-ROM version, for which subscriptions may be obtained from the Secretary of State, and an Internet version, available here. The Internet version is derived from the database prepared by the North Dakota Legislative Council. It may vary in some respects from the text in the CD-ROM version. Updates generally will appear in the Internet version sooner than in the CD-ROM version.

The numbering system for the Administrative Code is a four-part number, with each part separated by a hyphen. The first part refers to the title, the second to the article, the third to the chapter, and the fourth to the section. Basically, each agency is listed in alphabetical order and assigned a title number, each division or major administrative area is assigned an article number, each subject area is assigned a chapter number, and each rule is assigned a section number. The decimal point system is used to designate material that has been inserted between two consecutively numbered items.

The general authority source note refers to the specific statute authorizing the agency to adopt the rule. The law implemented source note refers to the specific statute implemented by the rule. In some cases, the general authority and the law implemented will be the same. In some cases, source references may be to federal laws or regulations, or to court cases.

The table of contents to this online version of the Administrative Code is the listing of titles of the code. Titles are captioned for the agency that adopts rules in the title. Selecting the appropriate title will direct you to the articles and chapters that make up the title.

RE: HB 1422 - Distribution of the Administrative Code

The adoption of this bill will save the state approximately \$3,200 per biennium.


In section 28-32-20 of the Century Code, the Secretary of State is mandated to print and distribute the administrative code without charge to approximately 111 recipients listed in subsection 1 of the current law (page 1, lines 9 through 23 and page 2, lines 1 through 7). This distribution is completed on a quarterly basis after the new administrative rules have been reviewed by the Administrative Rules Committee.

Although listed in the law, some recipients have requested that a copy no longer be mailed to them. Because the administrative code is available online (see attached Exhibits A and B), they no longer need or want a printed copy. Consequently, of the approximate 111 recipients listed in the law, a printed copy is currently being mailed to only fifty some recipients.

With the changes in this bill, the Secretary of State's duty will be to send an electronic message when a new supplement to the Administrative Code has been posted to notify the recipients listed in the law and to any person that requests to be so notified. The message will direct them to the pages where they will find the update on the Legislative Council's website (Exhibits A and B).

Under current law on page 2, lines 8 through 13, the agency can sell printed copies to subscribers. However, since no one has subscribed for several years, no revenue has been received and those lines have been overstruck.

Finally, according to N.D.C.C. § 54-03-24, legislators are entitled to receive a printed copy of the administrative code supplements. Currently, no legislator has made that request. With the changes in Section 2 and if they so request, legislators will receive an electronic message at the same time notification is sent to the recipients listed in the law.

Administrative Rules

The Legislative Council publishes the Administrative Code which is the codification of all rules of state administrative agencies, as that term is defined by North Dakota Century Code Section 28-32-02. Many state agencies are not administrative agencies as defined by Section 28-32-02. Although rules of those agencies are not required to be published in the Administrative Code, some agencies have consented to placing their rules in the code. Those agencies are identified with an explanatory note on the title page for that agency. The Administrative Code was initially published July 1, 1978. The Administrative Code is updated with quarterly changes. The Administrative Code is published in a CD-ROM version, for which subscriptions may be obtained from the Secretary of State, and an Internet version, available here. The Internet version is derived from the database prepared by the North Dakota Legislative Council. It may vary in some respects from the text in the CD-ROM version. Updates generally will appear in the Internet version sooner than in the CD-ROM version.

The numbering system for the Administrative Code is a four-part number, with each part separated by a hyphen. The first part refers to the title, the second to the article, the third to the chapter, and the fourth to the section. Basically, each agency is listed in alphabetical order and assigned a title number, each division or major administrative area is assigned an article number, each subject area is assigned a chapter number, and each rule is assigned a section number. The decimal point system is used to designate material that has been inserted between two consecutively numbered items.

The general authority source note refers to the specific statute authorizing the agency to adopt the rule. The law implemented source note refers to the specific statute implemented by the rule. In some cases, the general authority and the law implemented will be the same. In some cases, source references may be to federal laws or regulations, or to court cases.

The table of contents to this online version of the Administrative Code is the listing of titles of the code. Titles are captioned for the agency that adopts rules in the title. Selecting the appropriate title will direct you to the articles and chapters that make up the title.
