SENATE BILL NO. 2038 (2019) JANUARY 4, 2019 AT 10:00 A.M.

House Bill No. 1144 (2017) created a new chapter to Title 49 (created 49-22.1, pertaining to gas and liquid) which separates the combined siting requirements for electric energy conversion and transmission facilities from the siting requirements for gas or liquid energy conversion and transmission facilities. The bill also removed the requirement that a liquid or gas facility file a 10-year plan with the Public Service Commission. The bill repealed provisions referencing route adjustments for gas or liquid transmission lines within the chapter relating to electric energy conversion and transmission facilities.

Senate Bill No. 2286 (2017) required a gas or liquid transmission facility to be in compliance with the road use agreements of the impacted political subdivision prior to receiving a certificate of site compatibility or a route permit from the Public Service Commission. The bill required the commission to notify each specified political subdivision located in a proposed corridor of a public hearing and requires the political subdivision to provide the commission with a listing of all local land use, zoning, or building rules, regulations, and ordinances that apply to the proposed corridor. The bill provided any local regulations not filed at least 10 days before the hearing be deemed superseded and pre-empted.

If two bills are passed addressing the same section of North Dakota Century Code, it is the Code Revisor's duty to attempt to harmonize the two bills into the section. If the two bills cannot be harmonized, the Code Revisor must see whether one of the bills supercedes the other. Usually the bill passed last will prevail over any other conflicting bills. Senate Bill No. 2286 passed on April 3rd and House Bill No. 1144 passed on April 4th.

Some of the new items addressing gas or liquid transmission facilities landed in Section 49-22-16 when those items should have been incorporated in the newly created Chapter 49-22.1, which governs gas or liquid facility siting.

Senate Bill No. 2038 (2019) is a technical correction bill addressing the codification issues caused by the conflict between 2017 House Bill No. 1144 and Senate Bill No. 2286.

No negative votes were cast by the Natural Resources Committee.
