



Agency Update

The Ethics Commission was created pursuant to Article XIV of the North Dakota Constitution which became effective January 5, 2019. On August 8, 2019, five Commission members were appointed by the Governor and Senate Majority/Minority leaders: Ron Goodman (Bismarck), Chair; Dr. Cynthia Lindquist (St. Michael), Vice-Chair; Paul Richard (Fargo), Secretary; Ward Koeser (Williston); and David Anderson (Bismarck) with appointments effective September 1, 2019. Allyson Hicks, Assistant Attorney General, has been assigned as legal advisor to the Commission.

To date, the Commission has: obtained office space and furniture; hired myself and Office Manager, Holly Gaugler; held 12 public meetings; created and adopted rules relating to the complaint process and gifts between public officials and lobbyists; created a public website https://www.ethicscommission.nd.gov; and adopted a mission statement and an internal Code of Ethics. There have been three complaints filed with all dismissed. There are two pending complaints with the Commission that will be reviewed at the end of January.

Current Budget Status (Attachment #2)

The 2019-21 biennial budget for the Ethics Commission is \$517,155 in general funds with no one-time funding. As of December 31, 2020, we have spent \$298,365 with a remaining balance of \$218,790. We have attached a current budget update as of December 31, 2020, (Attachment #2). Although our budget is a single budget line, we have included a detailed listing of our expenditures.

Our current budget includes five commission members and two FTE's to include myself as the Executive Director. I was hired in my position in January 2019. We did not fill the administrative position utilizing the second FTE to conserve resources as well as being

uncertain of the required workload. In April of 2019, we hired a temporary part-time office manager as we continue to assess the full administrative requirements.

Due to the delayed hiring and related savings in office costs, we are estimating a general fund turn-back of approximately \$65,000 to \$75,000. The Commission did not receive special or federal funding and we did not receive COVID-19 federal funding.

2021-23 Budget (Attachment #3)

The 2021-23 budget submitted by the Ethics Commission included an adjusted base budget with a 5% general fund reduction (\$25,858) from our 2019-21 base of \$517,155 to \$491,297. Attachment #3 shows the reprioritization to meet that reduction by funding salaries for a full biennium and reducing operating costs to meet that requirement.

Our request also included an optional adjustment of \$150,708 to increase the 2021-23 budget to \$642,005 with \$475,989 in salaries and \$166,016 in operating costs. This is a net increase to the 2019-21 base budget of \$124,850. This included an increase of \$123,989 for salaries and \$861 for operating costs. No individual salary increases were requested in our submittal. The increase in salary costs is simply a reflection of a delay in hiring last biennium and full funding for five commissioners, the executive director and a part-time office manager. The vacant administrative FTE is retained in our budget request but not funded. We did not request any one-time funding.

The 2021-23 budget request funds one FTE, one part-time temporary employee and five commissioners for a total \$475,989. Operating costs consist of office rent (\$52,416); NDIT costs (\$38,900); estimated travel costs (\$37,600); investigative costs (\$20,000); rules notice advertising (\$10,000); and other miscellaneous operating costs (\$7,100) for a total of \$166,016.

The Governor's recommended budget of \$653,674 includes a total increase of \$136,519 to the base budget which fully funds salaries and benefits at \$487,705 with a recommended 2% increase each year of the biennium for the executive director position. This increase also provides \$165,969 in operational costs with \$50,000 of that amount in contingency costs. This contingency was part of the appropriated operating costs due to the uncertainty of overall costs for a full biennium.

In summary, the Governor' recommended budget of \$653,674 was \$11,669 higher than the Ethics Commission request of \$642,005. The Governor's budget included an increase of \$11,716 for the 2% salary increase for both years of the biennium and a net reduction of \$47 in operating expenses.





Agency Update

The Ethics Commission was created pursuant to Article XIV of the North Dakota Constitution which became effective January 5, 2019. On August 8, 2019, five Commission members were appointed by the Governor and Senate Majority/Minority leaders: Ron Goodman (Bismarck), Chair; Dr. Cynthia Lindquist (St. Michael), Vice-Chair; Paul Richard (Fargo), Secretary; Ward Koeser (Williston); and David Anderson (Bismarck) with appointments effective September 1, 2019.

To date, the Commission has: obtained office space and furniture; hired myself and Office Manager, Holly Gaugler; held 13 public meetings; created and adopted rules relating to the complaint process and gifts between public officials and lobbyists; created a public website https://www.ethicscommission.nd.gov; and adopted a mission statement and an internal Code of Ethics. I have presented seven training and educational sessions with various groups and participated on behalf of the Commission in the Interim Judiciary Committee review of Ethics Commission issues. There have been eleven complaints filed with all dismissed.

The complaint rules and gift rules have been carefully created and adopted to ensure the Commission follows the intent and the constitutional mandate set forth in Article XIV of

the Constitution and N.D.C.C. §54-66. The Commission will continue to propose and adopt rules relating to transparency, corruption, elections, and lobbying.

As citizens, public officials and lobbyists become more familiar with the Commission activities, we have received a significant number of requests for guidance to ensure compliance with Article XIV, N.D.C.C .54-66 and our rules. The Commission is committed to properly addressing citizen concerns in a manner that educates and corrects. The Commission has worked to create an environment that is not a "gotcha" entity, but instead focuses on identifying the problem, fixing the problem and then educate so others don't make the same mistake.

Current Budget Status (Attachment #2)

The 2019-21 biennial budget for the Ethics Commission is \$517,155 in general funds with no one-time funding. As of February 28, 2021, we have spent \$343,295 with a remaining balance of \$173,860. We have attached a current budget update as of February 28, 2021, (Attachment #2).

Our current budget includes five commission members and two FTE's to include myself as the Executive Director. The full-time salaries line includes five commissioners as well as the executive director. I was hired in January 2020 and being uncertain of the required workload in April of 2020, we hired a temporary part-time office manager, Holly Gaugler.

The Commission saved approximately \$168,000 this biennium due to delayed hiring and related savings in office costs. This saving also includes approximately \$21,000 in reduced travel costs due to COVID-19 restrictions. We are estimating a general fund turn-back of

approximately \$75,000. The Commission did not receive special or federal funding and we did not receive COVID-19 federal funding.

There were questions raised in the House regarding our budget. Commissioner Paul Richard will discuss staff salaries and requirements. The Constitution in Article XIV mandates the Legislature "adequately fund" the Ethics Commission. The Commission has aggressively reviewed costs to minimize impact to the state budget. As a comparison the Montana Commissioner of Political Practices has a budget of \$751,000 for FY 2021. New Mexico is a good "apples to apples" comparison in that they, like the North Dakota Ethics Commission, were created in 2018 by a constitutional amendment. The New Mexico Ethics Commission has a full-time staff of 6 which includes an Executive Director who is a lawyer and two additional lawyers. Their budget for FY 2021 is \$946,200 and they plan on hiring two addition staff in 2022. That is in comparison to our request of \$642,005 for the biennium or \$321,000 per year. We believe that demonstrates that we are being good stewards of our state resources and we will continue to aggressively monitor costs and strive for savings where appropriate while ensuring we have the resources and staff necessary to accomplish our mission.

2021-23 Budget Request (Attachment #3)

The Ethics Commission closely analyzed its current operating requirements and submitted the 2021-23 budget request at \$642,005. This is an increase of \$124,850 from the 2019-21 base budget of \$517,155 to fund salaries and minimal operating costs for 24 months.

The 2021-23 budget request submitted by the Commission funds one FTE (Executive Director), one part-time temporary employee and five commissioners for a total \$475,989. The vacant administrative FTE is retained in our budget request but is not funded.

Operating costs consist of office rent (\$52,416); NDIT costs (\$38,900); estimated travel costs (\$37,600); investigative costs (\$20,000); rules notice advertising (\$10,000); and other miscellaneous operating costs (\$7,100) for a total of \$166,016. We did not request one-time funding.

The Governor's recommendation of \$653,674 includes a total increase of \$136,519 to the base budget which fully funds salaries and benefits at \$487,705 with a recommended 2% increase each year of the biennium for the executive director position. The vacant unfunded FTE was also retained in the Governor's recommendation. The executive recommendation also provides \$165,969 in operational costs with \$50,000 of that amount in contingency costs. This contingency was part of the appropriated operating costs due to the uncertainty of overall costs for a full biennium.

In summary, the Governor' recommended budget of \$653,674 was \$11,669 higher than the Ethics Commission request of \$642,005. The Governor's budget included an increase of \$11,716 for the 2% salary increase and benefits for both years of the biennium and a net reduction of \$47 in operating expenses but includes Microsoft Office 365 license increase of \$661.

House Amendment (Attachment #4)

The House reduced the 2019-21 base budget of \$517,155 by 5% to \$491,297. The House also added salary and benefit increases for \$7,257 and Microsoft Office 365 license increase of \$661 for a total amended appropriation of \$499,215 which is \$17,940 less than our current 2019-21 funding. The vacant unfunded FTE was also removed by the House.

If salaries are fully funded at \$483,246, the decrease of \$17,940 of the current base budget of \$517,155 to \$499,215, would leave \$15,969 in operating costs creating an operating shortfall of \$150,708.

Mr. Chairman, that concludes my testimony and I will gladly stand for any questions you may have.

ENGROSSED HB 1024 TESTIMONY OF COMMISSIONER, PAUL RICHARD NORTH DAKOTA ETHICS COMMISSION BEFORE THE

SENATE APROPRIATIONS March 23, 2021

Mr. Chairman and Members of the Government Operations Division, my name is Paul Richard, Commissioner for the North Dakota Ethics Commission. Prior to my appointment as Commissioner with the ND Ethics Commission, I served as the Executive Vice President of Sanford Health Fargo until my retirement in 2018. I began my career with Sanford Health as General Counsel of MeritCare Health System (now Sandford Health) in 1998. Prior to that I practiced law for 20 years with Serkland Law Firm in Fargo.

I would like to provide some additional information on the North Dakota Ethics Commission in addition to an <u>email</u> to House appropriation members provided by Ronald Goodman, Chair of the North Dakota Ethics Commission, regarding the Ethics Commission's executive director salary. It is our understanding that during discussion of the Ethics Commission's budget in the House, concerns were expressed regarding the level of compensation paid to the executive director. In addition to the information provided by Ethics Commission Chair Goodman, we would like to offer the following information for your consideration.

When the Ethics Commission began its work in September 2019, we identified that one of the first orders of business would be to recruit and hire an experienced executive director to be located in Bismarck. We needed an executive director who could "hit the ground running" and guide the Commissioners in their work to implement Article XIV of the North Dakota Constitution, North Dakota Century Code Chapter 54-66, and other laws applicable to the work of the Commission. As the Commission discussed and planned for the work that needed to be accomplished, we concluded that the executive director must be a licensed attorney with extensive legal and legislative experience. We found that individual in Dave Thiele. His background as an

experienced lawyer, in particularly state experience, made him uniquely qualified to serve as the first executive director of the Ethics Commission, (resume attached). It has now been a little over one year since Mr. Thiele was hired and his performance has been exemplary. His legal skills, state work experience and knowledge, have enabled the Commission to complete the work that needed to be accomplished.

Given Mr. Thiele's background and experience, in March 2020, working with HRMS the Commission was comfortable setting Mr. Thiele's annual salary at \$135,000 which equates to \$64.90 per hour and does not exceed the HRMS salary range for a similar classified position-Attorney III position or a grade of 108. In addition, Mr. Thiele waived State employee medical benefits which would be approximately \$34,000 per biennium. To put this in perspective a contract Administrative Law Judge is reimbursed at a rate of \$150 per hour and investigators for WSI are reimbursed at \$85 per hour. ITD charges state agencies for their data processing services at various hourly rates, the lowest of which is \$76 per hour with most services being charges at \$99 per hour or higher.

It is also important to highlight the nature and extent of the work performed, and to be performed, by Mr. Thiele in the position of executive director. While the following examples do not provide a complete list of what the Commissioners expect by way of performance, we believe they do illustrate why a lawyer with Mr. Thiele's background and experience is necessary for the executive director position.

1. In order to fulfill the Ethics Commission's duties as outlined in Article XIV of the North Dakota Constitution and North Dakota Century Code Chapter 54-66, the Commission needed to create the rules, procedures and documents needed for the receipt and processing of complaints. Similarly, under Article XIV, the Ethics Commission evaluated and considered exceptions to the lobbyist gift restrictions. Mr. Thiele's experience in research and drafting of proposed rules, procedures and forms, guided the Commission. His knowledge and experience with the administrative rules

processes assured that the final Commission rules were adopted and approved in a timely manner.

- 2. The Commission considers education to be an important function to be carried out by the executive director to inform the public of the Commission's role. Mr. Thiele's communication skills and ability have been invaluable to assure North Dakota citizens receive timely responses to their inquiries. The executive director must be comfortable with public speaking and communicate in a clear manner. Mr. Thiele has done an excellent job in his communication with members of the public.
- 3. The Commission has the expectation that complaints that warrant further investigation will be investigated by the executive director rather than employed or contracted investigators. With the exception of situations where Mr. Thiele may have a conflict, it is expected that he will conduct the investigations that may be needed to evaluate complaints. His background as a lawyer and compliance investigations were important considerations in the Commission's selection of Mr. Thiele. Mr. Thiele brought to the executive director role the integrity, common sense, and focus needed to conduct the evaluation and investigation of complaints filed with the Commission.
- 4. The Commission has been asked to provide advisory opinions to individuals to assist them in compliance with the requirements of Article XIV, North Dakota Century Code Chapter 54-66 and other State laws dealing with transparency, corruption, elections and lobbying. It is the Commission's expectation that the executive director will evaluate, research, and draft advisory opinions that will be considered by the Commission. As a North Dakota attorney, Mr. Thiele is familiar with a similar procedure used by the North Dakota Supreme Court to provide advisory opinions to licensed lawyers as they seek guidance to assure compliance with the North Dakota Rules of Professional Conduct.

5. Article XIV of the North Dakota Constitution identifies the authority of the Ethics Commission to adopt ethics rules related to transparency, corruption, elections and lobbying. Mr. Thiele is expected to research existing North Dakota laws as well as rules, regulations and laws from other states and jurisdictions to provide guidance to the Commission on potential ethics rules that may be appropriate.

The Ethics Commission strongly believed that the hiring of an executive director with the education, training and experience of Mr. Thiele was pivotal in assuring that the Ethics Commission achieved the expectations implemented in Article XIV of the North Dakota Constitution and North Dakota Century Code Chapter 54-66. Working with HRMS, Mr. Thiele's compensation was set within the normal salary range for an appointed position based on the level of responsibility and experience necessary to be successful. Mr. Thiele has performed in an exemplary manner and accomplished much in his first year as executive director.

The Commission appreciates the opportunity to present information to the Committee regarding the Commission's overall budget and, specifically, the executive director's compensation. Thank you.
