During the 2017 legislative assembly, statute was established providing the state superintendent the authority to waive particular sections of the North Dakota Century Code when supported by a comprehensive, systemic plan from participating districts. These comprehensive plans required multi-year approaches and documented support from teachers, school staff, parents, and community members. This flexibility was so much more than a "waiver" from something; it was about deliberately planning, and systemically implementing a strategic plan for better delivery of education with better outcomes for North Dakota students. The flexibility
