There is appropriated out of any moneys in the community health trust fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$7,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of health and human services for the purpose of aiding the functions and operations of rural emergency medical services and rural ambulance service districts, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025."

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Testimony House Bill 1477 House Human Services Tuesday, January 31 2023; 10:30 a.m. North Dakota Emergency Medical Services Association

Good morning, Chairman Weisz and members of the committee. My name is Adam Parker, I speaking on behalf of the North Dakota Emergency Medical Services Association. I am here today in support of HB 1477.

The EMS Association has long believed that rural ambulance service districts are the best avenue to ensure long-term sustainability of EMS in rural areas. Rural ambulance service districts serve two important functions, they have an elected board that is responsible for developing an local EMS plan, and they have the ability to levy taxes to support the plan and ensure reasonable ambulance coverage within the territory.

Last legislative session, the EMS Association supported a bill that eased many burdens to establishing rural ambulance service districts. Since that time, several ambulance services have taken advantage of those provisions to establish districts, annex territory, or increase their maximum allowed mill rate. The bill represents several small changes to further reduce burdens and to clarify several points to ensure ambulances districts are compliant with applicable law.

First, the bill removes the petition requirements for cities located within the proposed ambulance district territory. It has proven difficult for auditors to determine the qualified electors residing within the cities and this has resulted in added complexity and delays in the petitioning process.

Second, the bill would remove the June 30th requirement to submit a budget to the auditors. If the question of district formation is on the June ballot, it is impossible to organize the district and submit a budget to the auditor by the statutorily required date. Changing the date to August 10th aligns with other political subdivisions and ensure ambulance funding is not delayed.

Third, it removed the bonding requirements for the secretary-treasurer. N.D.C.C 26.1-21-01.1 requires all board members to be bonded, and having a separate bond for the secretary-treasurer is an added expense to the district.

Fourth, rural ambulance districts always express an interest in banking locally. Sometimes this involves banking at a credit union. This small change would ensure ambulance districts are able to bank at credit unions.

Lastly, the bill last session made it possible for ambulance districts to annex territory they currently provide ambulance coverage too. The citation to 57-40.6-10 refers to the requirement that the quickest ambulance by predetermined response areas must be dispatched. However, in one case this was misinterpreted and resulted in delayed funding to the ambulance service. Therefore, we feel reference to 23-27-01, would alleviate any confusion in the future and ensure the legislative intent of allowing ambulance districts to annex territory that they have been assigned to serve.

Amendment for 1477 EMS

- 11-28.3-15. Territory to be annexed.
- 2. If the area to be annexed is not serviced by the district under section 57-40.6-10 within the designated service area as established under subsection 1 of section 23-27-01, the proceedings for the annexation may be initiated by a presentation to the county auditor. If more than one county is in the proposed annexed territory, the auditor serving the larger portion shall coordinate with other county auditors to create a petition stating the desires and purposes of the petitioners signed by fifty qualified electors, or if there are not fifty qualified electors in the proposed territory, fifty percent of qualified electors residing within the boundaries of the territory. The petition must contain a description of the boundaries of the territory proposed to be annexed and must be accompanied by a map or plat and a deposit for publication costs.
- 11-28.3-16. Withdrawal from ambulance service district Restrictions.
- 2. Notwithstanding section 57-40.6-10 subsection 1 of section 23-27-01 designating an ambulance service area, the district is not obligated to maintain the withdrawn district within the primary response area of the district

 - Change in the date that the president and secretary must submit an estimate of district expenses to the county auditor from on or before June 30 to on or before August 10th.
- Removes the bonding requirement from this section as it already exists in another section. Subsection 1 of Section 26.1-12—01 Blanket Bond/Political subdivisions
- 4) Updates the language to allow collected funds to be placed in a bank or credit union, removing old "state or National bank language. Allows to bank locally.
- 5) Removes the inappropriate chapter reference and now references the Health Department Code that designates service areas.
- 6) Provide \$7 million in grants. Department of Health and Human Services for the purpose of aiding the functions and operations of rural emergency medical services and rural ambulance service districts,

APPLICABLE LAW:

Subsection 1 of Section 26.1-12-01 defines a "blanket bond" as a bond that covers collectively all public employees and public officials without the necessity of scheduling names or positions as a part of the bond, and a bond whereby new public employees and new public officials entering employment or office during the period of the bond are automatically included without notice to the fund.

Subsection 4 of Section 26.1-12-01 defines "political subdivision" as a county, township, park district, school district, city, and <u>any other unit of local government which is created either by statute</u> or by the Constitution of North Dakota for local government or <u>other public purposes</u>.

Subsection 5 of Section 26.1-21-01 defines "public employee" <u>as an individual employed by</u> a state agency or <u>any political subdivision</u>, an officer or employee eligible under section 57-15-56, an employee under section 61-16.1-05, and an officer or employee of an international peace garden. "Public employee" does not include an individual employed by an occupational and professional board or commission under title 43 or by the state bar association.

Subsection 6 of Section 26.1-21-01 defines "public official" as **an elected or appointed officer** or deputy **of** a state agency or **a political subdivision**, except for an officer of an occupational and professional board or commission under title 43 or of the state bar association.

<u>Section 26.1-21-09</u> requires each political subdivision to pay premiums before bond coverage takes effect. The premiums must be placed in the state bonding fund, which the insurance commissioner manages.

ANALYSIS:

Rural ambulance service districts are political subdivisions because they are created by statute for public purposes. Furthermore, Section 54-10-14 classifies rural ambulance service districts as a political subdivision. Because of that fact, all employees and officials of rural ambulance service districts are public employees and public officials. Therefore, blanket bonds apply to the employees and officials of rural ambulance service districts, including the secretary-treasurer.

I imagine the bonding provision in <u>Section 11-28.3-09</u> for the secretary-treasurer is being eliminated as a cost-saving measure because the secretary-treasurer is already covered under <u>Chapter 26.1-21</u>.

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This bill was amended in the House to include an appropriation to fully fund, or nearly fully fund, the Rural EMS Assistance Grant. This grant is critical to assist rural ambulance service hire staff and fund their operations. Last biennium, the grant contained an appropriation of \$6.875 million which funded services at 29% of the formulas calculation. Based on the formula currently contained in HB1294 we believe the current \$6.875 million in the Health Department budget, combined with the \$7 million appropriation in this bill would fully fund the formula.
