TESTIMONY OF

David Stradinger, Manager of the Radiation & Indoor Air Quality Control Program

Good afternoon Chairman Patten and members of the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee. My name is David Stradinger and I am the Manager of the Radiation and Indoor Air Quality Control Program of the Division of Waste Management of the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ). The DEQ is responsible for the implementation and enforcement of many of the federal and state environmental protection programs in North Dakota. I provide this testimony in support of Senate Bill 2076.

To help ensure facility operational integrity and safe handling of specific hazardous materials, the DEQ can require individuals or responsible parties to complete a criminal history background check prior to gaining employment or receiving a permit or license to operate in the state. Some record checks may go beyond the state boundaries and require access to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Criminal History Record Information (CHRI).

As part of the 2021 amendments to NDCC 12-60-24(2)(vv) and addition of NDCC 23.1-01-11.1, the US Department of Justice – Office of General Counsel - Criminal Justice Information Law Unit (CJILU) reviewed NDCC 12-60-24(2) as it relates to the requirement for state or federal criminal history background checks. It was determined the law as written did not qualify the state for access to the FBI CHRI pursuant to Pub. L 92-544.

As NDCC 12-60-24(2)(vv) was previously approved by CJILU, the FBI placed NDCC 12-60-24(2)(vv) on a grace period until July 31, 2023. During the grace period, the FBI would continue to honor fingerprints submitted for final applicants for an employee specified in occupation in the DEQ, an individual investigated by the DEQ, or an applicant for registration, certification, or licensure by the DEQ pursuant to this authority.

SB 2076 addresses concerns of the FBI in the following sections:

<u>Section 1</u>: Provides specificity as to the types of individuals or occupations that may require a criminal history background check;

<u>Section 2</u>: Provides language that the DEQ may require applicants for a radioactive materials license or a solid waste permit, as a part of an environmental compliance background review, to complete a statewide and federal criminal history background check. This section also provides the meaning of "applicant", and reasons for application denial.

The proposed changes to the statute have been provided to the DOJ for their review and concurrence.

Mr. Chairman and committee members, this concludes my testimony. I ask for your support for Senate Bill 2076 with the requested amendments. I would be happy to answer any questions.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL NO. 2076

Page 1, line 1, after "A Bill" replace the remainder of the bill with "for an Act to amend and reenact subdivision vv of subsection 2 of section 12-60-24 and section 23.1-01-11.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to environmental compliance background reviews of applicants for a radioactive materials license or solid waste permit.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subdivision vv of subsection 2 of section 12-60-24 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

vv. The department of environmental quality for a final applicant for a job opening—or, a current employee with the department; an individual being investigated by the department; or, when requested by the department, an applicant for a radioactive materials license under chapter 23.1-03 or a solid waste permit under chapter 23.1-08 as provided in section 23.1-01-11.1.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 23.1-01-11.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

23.1-01-11.1. Criminal history background checks.

- 1. The As part of an environmental compliance background review, the department may require an applicant for a radioactive materials license under chapter 23.1-03 or a solid waste permit under chapter 23.1-08 to complete a statestatewide and nationwide criminal history record check as provided in section 12-60-24. If the applicant is not an individual, the department may require an individual responsible for the applicant to complete a state and a nationwide criminal history record check as provided in section 12-60-24. The applicant or responsible individual shall submit personal information and fingerprints with the application necessary to complete the statestatewide and nationwide criminal history—background record check in the manner provided in subsection 1 of section 12-60-24. All costs associated with the statestatewide and nationwide criminal history record check are the responsibility of the applicant.
- 2. For purposes of this section, an "applicant" means the person applying for the license or permit, and includes:

- <u>a.</u> Each entity as defined in subsection 7 of section 10-01.1-02 that is, or is proposed to be:
 - (1) A partner in a partnership as defined in subsection 19 of section 45-13-01;
 - (2) An entity holding ten percent or more of the applicant's debt;
 - (3) An entity holding ten percent or more of the applicant's equity; or
 - (4) The parent of a corporation as defined in subsection 46 of section 10-19.1-01.
- <u>b.</u> Each individual who has, or is proposed to have, any of the following relationships with the applicant:
 - (1) A board member as defined in subsection 8 of section 10-19.1-01;
 - (2) A partner in a partnership as defined in subsection 19 of section 45-13-01;
 - (3) An officer as defined in section 10-15-29 or 10-19.1-52;
 - (4) A radiation safety officer as defined in North Dakota Administrative Code subsection 34 of section 33.1-10-01-04;
 - (5) A holder of ten percent or more of the applicant's debt; or
 - (6) A holder of ten percent or more of the applicant's equity.
- 3. The department may deny an application for the issuance, renewal, transfer, or major modification of a license or permit based on its environmental compliance background review.
 - a. Reasons for denial include:
 - (1) The applicant has intentionally misrepresented or concealed any material fact in a statement required under this section;
 - (2) The applicant has been convicted of a felony or pleaded guilty or nolo contendere to a felony involving the laws of

- any state or the federal government within five years preceding the application;
- (3) The applicant has been adjudicated in contempt of an order of any court enforcing the laws of this state or any other state or the federal government within five years preceding the application; or
- (4) The applicant has repeatedly violated any state or federal environmental protection laws.
- b. The department shall also consider the relevance of the offense to the business to which the license or permit is issued, the nature and seriousness of the offense, the circumstances under which the offense occurred, the date of the offense, and the ownership and management structure in place at the time of the offense."
