PROPOSED AMENDMENT PROVISION FOR OCTOBER 2023 SPECIAL LEGISLATIVE SESSION

The following is a proposed amendment provision for the October 2023 special legislative session to increase the Emergency Commission's state contingency fund appropriation by \$350,000 from the general fund, from \$400,000 to \$750,000. The funding is included in the appropriation bill for the Office of Management and Budget.

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the office of management and budget for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the office of management and budget, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025, as follows:

PROPOSED AMENDMENT PROVISION FOR OCTOBER 2023 SPECIAL LEGISLATIVE SESSION

The following is a proposed amendment provision for the October 2023 special legislative session to provide a grant to the Board of Social Work Examiners.

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - OFFICE OF MANAGEMENT AND BUDGET - GRANT. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$300,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the office of management and budget for the purpose of providing a grant to the board of social work examiners for software enhancements, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2025.
