

# PROPOSED AMENDMENT PROVISION FOR OCTOBER 2023 SPECIAL LEGISLATIVE SESSION

The following is a proposed amendment provision for the October 2023 special legislative session to provide an extension and additional funding to the Adjutant General for snow removal grants.

# SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION - ADJUTANT GENERAL - 2021-23 SNOW REMOVAL GRANTS - EXTENSION.

- There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$106,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the adjutant general for the purpose of providing additional 2021-23 snow removal grants to tribal governments, counties, cities, and townships, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2025.
- 2. A tribal government, county, township, or city that did not receive a snow removal grant during the 2021-23 biennium and submitted its application and required documentation for a 2021-23 snow removal grant to the department of emergency services prior to October 20, 2023, is eligible for a grant under this section.
