1	A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 43 of the North Dakota Century
2	Code, relating to the regulation of community health workers; to amend and reenact section
3	23-17.3-01 and subdivision h of subsection 1 of section 23-17.3-05 of the North Dakota Century
4	Code, relating to the regulation of home health agencies; to provide for a community health
5	worker task force; to provide a statement of legislative intent; to provide for a report to the
6	legislative assembly; and to provide an appropriation; and to declare an emergency.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 23-17.3-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

23-17.3-01. Definitions.

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In this chapter, unless the context and subject matter otherwise require:

- <u>"Allowed practitioner" means a physician assistant or advanced practice registered nurse.</u>
- 2. "Clinical record" means a written account which covers the services the agency provides directly and those provided through arrangements with another agency which account contains pertinent past and current medical, nursing, social, and other therapeutic information, including the plan of treatment.
- 2.3. "Department" means the department of health and human services.
- 3.4. "Home health agency" means a public or private agency, organization, facility, or subdivision thereof which is engaged in providing home health services to individuals and families where they are presently residing for the purpose of preventing disease and promoting, maintaining, or restoring health or minimizing the effects of illness or disability.

1 4.5. "Home health aide" means an individual who renders personal related service under 2 the supervision of a registered professional nurse. 3 5.6. "Home health services" means a broad range of health and social services furnished 4 to individuals and families by a home health agency or by others under arrangements 5 with the agency, in the places where the recipients are presently residing. Services 6 must include the services of a currently licensed registered professional nurse and at 7 least one other therapeutic service and may include additional support services. These 8 services may only be provided with the approval of a licensed physician or an allowed 9 practitioner. 10 6.7. "Licensed practical nurse" means one who has met all legal requirements for licensure 11 and holds a current license to practice in North Dakota pursuant to chapter 43-12.1. 12 7.8. "Nursing services" means those services pertaining to the preventive, curative, and 13 restorative aspects of nursing care that are performed by or under the supervision of a 14 registered professional nurse. 15 8.9. "Person" means an individual, firm, partnership, association, corporation, limited 16 liability company, or any other entity, whether organized for profit or not. 17 9.10. "Physician" means any person currently licensed pursuant to chapter 43-17. 18 10.11. "Registered professional nurse" means a registered nurse as defined under chapter 19 43-12.1. 20 11.12. "Skilled nursing" means professional nursing services rendered by nurses licensed 21 under chapter 43-12.1. 22 12.13. "Supportive services" includes the use of medical appliances; medical supplies, other 23 than drugs and biologicals prescribed by a physician; the collection of blood and other 24 samples for laboratory analysis; and nutritional guidance, homemaker, or companion 25 services. 26 13.14. "Therapeutic services" means services which include: 27 Skilled nursing care. a. 28 Medical social services. b. 29 Home health aide services. C. 30 d. 21		and a North Dakota community health worker collaborative.

1	SECTION 5. DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES - COMMUNITY
2	HEALTH WORKERS - MEDICAID STATE PLAN AMENDMENT. During the 2023-25 biennium,
3	the department of health and human services shall seek a Medicaid state plan amendment to
4	authorize the reimbursement of certified community health workers. Upon amendment of the
5	Medicaid state plan, the commissioner of the department of health and human services shall
6	certify this fact to legislative management.
7	SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES -
8	COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKER TASK FORCE. There is appropriated out of any moneys in
9	the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$50,000 \$100,000
10	or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of health and human services
11	for the purpose of contracting with a third party to assist the community health worker task force
12	with data collection, meeting facilitation, and report development for the biennium period
13	beginning July 1, 2023, with the effective date of this section and ending June 30, 2025.
14	SECTION 7. EMERGENCY. Sections 4 and 6 of this Act are declared to be emergency
15	measures.
