USDA-AMS is entering into cooperative agreements with each U.S. State and Territory for Resilient Food Systems Infrastructure (RFSI) Program. ND Department of Agriculture (NDDA) has been allocated \$4,690,280.40; however, this emergency commission request is only for half of the funding since this is a four-year grant. NDDA plans to develop and administer coordinated initiatives to middle-of-the-food-supply-chain in the state. Funds will support expanded capacity for the aggregation, processing, manufacturing, storing, transporting, wholesaling, and distribution of locally and regionally produced food products, including specialty crops, dairy, grains for human consumption, and other food products. NDDA will create more and better processing options for eligible entities and farm businesses, and other sectors by targeting gaps and opportunities to support the agriculture supply chain.

Will funding be required in future bienniums? Yes

Provide explanation:

The cooperative agreement duration is for four years, ending May 24, 2027. Year one (1) will be dedicated to collecting applicants and approving them through a competitive review process. Years two – four (2-4) will be dedicated to starting and completing the items approved in the grant applications.
