# STANDING UP FOR FREEDOM DEFENDING THE SECOND AMENDMENT

Committee Hearing Date: 1/22/2021

Mr. Chairman and Members of the Committee,

My name is Matt Mammoser and I am the Northwest Regional Director at the National Association for Gun Rights. I am submitting this testimony on behalf of our members in North Dakota regarding our support for House Bill 1293.

As a representative of the leading gun rights organization advocating for Constitutional Carry nationwide, we applaud Rep. Rick Becker and House Bill 1293 for fixing minor issues in North Dakota's Constitutional Carry law.

House Bill 1293 will bring North Dakota into full conformity with true Constitutional Carry statutes as seen in over a dozen other states by allowing any law-abiding adult (resident or non-resident) who is able to legally possess a handgun to carry it openly, or concealed while in North Dakota.

House Bill 1293 will also allow for law-abiding adults to carry their loaded handgun openly or concealed while driving in a vehicle, codifying the AG's ruling from 2017.

As seen all across the nation, true Constitutional Carry legislation contains no extra requirements to carry a handgun open or concealed. If you are not prohibited from possessing a handgun, you should not be prohibited from carrying it.

Constitutional Carry should allow law-abiding citizens to carry in equal places with or without a permit. If citizens with a license are not prohibited from carrying there, neither are those without a license. Regarding restrictions on where a person can carry, Constitutional Carry legislation should remove inequalities between someone who has a license and someone who does not.

As evidenced by FBI crime statistics, states with Constitutional Carry have some of the lowest violent crime rates in the entire country. Allowing law-abiding adults to freely exercise their Second Amendment rights keeps innocent people safe, and lets criminals know they do not have free reign to commit unlawful acts of violence.

Rep. Becker's House Bill 1293 does exactly this, and we fully support his legislation.

We ask that the Energy and Natural Resources Committee pass House Bill 1293 and apply the Second Amendment right to bear arms equally to all law-abiding citizens.

My name is Catherine Lee (Plath) and I live on a farm outside Davenport, ND with my family who are gun owners. I appreciate the opportunity to submit my thoughts on this important topic.

I ask you to please give a do NOT PASS recommendation to HB 1293.

Growing up in this state I've always thought of its people as sensible and down to earth. This proposed bill removes what few safety efforts exist for acquiring a gun, and thus, for the members of our state. Qualifying for a permit is one of the pathways to safe and responsible gun ownership.

In an article released in August, the CDC reported that 10.7% of Americans had seriously contemplated suicide in the weeks of June. This startling number is up from 4.3% from the same time in 2018. The rates of suicide ideation were highest among unpaid caregivers for adults, and 18-24 year olds. Annually 22,926 people die by gun suicide each year in our nation. Of that number, North Dakota has the 11<sup>th</sup> highest rate of gun suicide deaths in the U.S. These statistics do not lend themselves to loosening existing policies to acquiring gun permits.

Please consider the safety of North Dakotans first. I'm all for people having guns, but let's just make it safe for everyone.

A person who has a valid license issued by another state to carry a concealed firearm or dangerous weapon in that state and whose state grants to residents of this state the right to carry a concealed firearm or dangerous weapon without requiring a separate license to carry a concealed firearm or dangerous weapon issued by that state may carry, subject to the provisions of this state's law, a concealed firearm or dangerous weapon in this state, and the other state's license is valid in this state.
- 2. This section may not be construed to require a person who is not otherwise prohibited by law from possessing a handgun to obtain a license to carry a handgun in plain view or secured.
- SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 62.1-04-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

## 62.1-04-04. Producing license upon request - Penalty.

- 1. Every individual while carrying a concealed firearm or dangerous weapon, for which a license to carry concealed is required, shall have on one's person the license issued by this or another state or a digital image of one's concealed firearm or dangerous weapon license issued by this state on an electronic device and shall give it to any active law enforcement officer for an inspection upon request by the officer. The failure of any individual to give the license or digital image of the license to the officer is primafacie evidence the individual is illegally carrying a firearm or dangerous weapon concealed.
- 2. Every individual carrying a concealed firearm under the authority granted in subsection 2 of section 62.1-04-02 shall inform a law enforcement officer of the individual's possession of a concealed weapon upon the initiation of a traffic stop or any other in-person contact initiated by a law enforcement officer.
- 3. Every individual carrying a concealed firearm under the authority granted in subsection 2 of section 62.1-04-02 must have on one's person a valid driver's license or nondriver identification card issued by the department of transportation or a digital image of one's valid driver's license or nondriver identification card on a mobile device and shall provide the license or card to any law enforcement officer for inspection upon request by the officer.

by a fee of twenty dollars.

   10 40-49-26. Park district loan program Continuing appropriation.
  - 1. A park district loan fund is established. The moneys transferred to the park district loan fund under subsection 2 of section 54-17.8-02 are made available to the Bank of North Dakota on a continuing basis for making loans in accordance with this section.
  - 2. The industrial commission shall approve projects and loans under this section, and the Bank of North Dakota shall manage and administer the loans. Loans made under this section must be made at the same interest rate as loans made from the revolving loan fund established under chapters 61-28.1 and 61-28.2.
    - 3. The industrial commission shall consider the following information when evaluating proposed projects and may adopt policies for review and approval of loans for proposed projects:
    - a. The nature and purposes of the proposed project, including an explanation of the need for the project, the reasons why the project is in the public interest, and the overall economic impact of the project;

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- <u>b.</u> The estimated cost of the project, the amount of the loan sought, and other proposed sources of funding; and
- c. The extent to which completion of the project will provide a benefit to the state or park district.
- 4. Park district projects not eligible for other state funding must be given priority for loans under this section.

**SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-17.8-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

## 54-17.8-02. North Dakota outdoor heritage fund - Continuing appropriation.

- 1. There is created a North Dakota outdoor heritage fund that is governed by the commission. Any Except as provided in subsection 2, money deposited in the fund is appropriated on a continuing basis to the commission for the purposes of this chapter. Interest earned by the fund must be credited to the fund. The commission shall keep accurate records of all financial transactions performed under this chapter.
- 2. Ten percent of the oil extraction moneys deposited in oil and gas gross production tax collections allocated to the North Dakota outdoor heritage fund under section 57-51-15, not to exceed a cumulative total deposit from the oil extraction moneys of twenty-five million dollars, are must be transferred by the state treasurer to the park district loan fund established under section 40-49-26 outdoor heritage revolving loan fund under section 2 of this Act.

**SECTION 2.** A new section to chapter 54-17.8 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

#### Outdoor heritage revolving loan fund - Continuing appropriation.

- There is created in the state treasury the outdoor heritage revolving loan fund. The fund consists of all oil and gas gross production tax revenue transferred under section 54-17.8-02, interest upon moneys in the fund, and principal and interest payments to the fund. All moneys in the fund are appropriated to the Bank of North Dakota on a continuing basis to provide loans based on recommendations from the North Dakota outdoor heritage advisory board and for administrative costs pursuant to this section.
- 2. The advisory board shall make recommendations for loans under this section. To be eligible for a loan under this section, a project must meet the criteria under section

# STANDING UP FOR FREEDOM DEFENDING THE SECOND AMENDMENT

Mrs. Chairman and Members of the Committee,

My name is Matt Mammoser and I am the Northwest Regional Director at the National Association for Gun Rights. I am submitting this testimony on behalf of our members in North Dakota regarding our support for House Bill 1293.

As a representative of the leading gun rights organization advocating for Constitutional Carry nationwide, we applaud Rep. Rick Becker and House Bill 1293 for fixing minor issues in North Dakota's Constitutional Carry law.

As originally written, House Bill 1293 would bring North Dakota into full conformity with true Constitutional Carry statutes as seen in over a dozen other states by allowing any law-abiding adult (resident or non-resident) who is able to legally possess a handgun to carry it openly, or concealed while in North Dakota.

House Bill 1293 will also allow for law-abiding adults to carry their loaded handgun openly or concealed while driving in a vehicle, codifying the AG's ruling from 2017.

As you know the House Energy and Natural Resources Committee amended the bill to add the residency requirement back in at 30 days. Although this is a step in the right direction compared to the current 1 year, it is still an infringement on law-abiding visitors and new residents' gun rights.

They also amended HB 1293 to remove the church carry portion. As we saw two years ago in Texas, countless lives could have been lost if not for a good guy with a gun. We urge the Senate Judiciary Committee to also remove permission requirements for carrying in churches and other places of worship.

As seen all across the nation, true Constitutional Carry legislation contains no extra requirements to carry a handgun open or concealed. If you are not prohibited from possessing a handgun, you should not be prohibited from carrying it.

Constitutional Carry should allow law-abiding citizens to carry in equal places with or without a permit. If citizens with a license are not prohibited from carrying there, neither are those without a license. Regarding restrictions on where a person can carry, Constitutional Carry legislation should remove inequalities between someone who has a license and someone who does not.

As evidenced by FBI crime statistics, states with Constitutional Carry have some of the lowest violent crime rates in the entire country. Allowing law-abiding adults to freely exercise their Second Amendment rights keeps innocent people safe, and lets criminals know they do not have free reign to commit unlawful acts of violence.

Rep. Becker's House Bill 1293 would do exactly this as originally written.

We ask that the Senate Judiciary Committee remove all restrictions to carry legally-owned firearms and pass House Bill 1293 to apply the Second Amendment right to bear arms equally to all lawabiding citizens.
