Andrew Alexis Varvel March 11, 2021

Chairman Kasper and Members of the Committee:

My name is Andrew Alexis Varvel. I live in Bismarck.

Please give SB 2063 a DO PASS recommendation.

This amendment would provide the State Historical Society of North Dakota with greater flexibility to manage its collections on behalf of the people of North Dakota.

The Nickel Trophy should be exhibited periodically as part of a contextualized display. It could be part of an exhibit about our state's history of higher education, our state's sports history, or a history of depictions of indigenous peoples in popular culture.

One problem with mandating a permanent display of the Nickel Trophy is that it may decontextualize its historical significance. It would be rather like the difference between exhibiting a Triceratops skull all by itself and exhibiting a Triceratops skull within a context that tells a greater story about North Dakota's Hell Creek Formation's ecology that would include flora and fauna from the Upper Cretaceous Period.

So, to help the State Historical Society better curate the Nickel Trophy and build better displays to explain historical context, please recommend a DO PASS for Senate Bill 2063.

AGREEMENT TO TRANSFER TITLE AND OWNERSHIP

This Agreement to Transfer Title and Ownership is made on this day of December, 2020 by and between the State of North Dakota, by and through its State Historical Society; the University of North Dakota Student Senate; Blue Key Honor Society, North Dakota State University chapter; University of North Dakota; North Dakota State University; and the North Dakota State Board of Higher Education in order to transfer title and ownership of the Nickel Trophy to the State Historical Society for preservation and display, at its discretion, in perpetuity.

WHEREAS, the Nickel Trophy is a trophy inaugurated in 1938 in the shape of a onceminted U.S. nickel. Said trophy is two inches thick and 22 inches in diameter and weighs 75 pounds;

WHEREAS, previously, the Nickel Trophy was historically owned by the Blue Key Honor Society of UND and the Blue Key Honor Society of NDSU and was awarded by the Blue Key Honor Society of NDSU or UND to the winner of the University of North Dakota-North Dakota State football game;

WHEREAS, the Nickel Trophy has not been awarded to either school since 2003;

WHEREAS, the 65th Legislative Assembly passed 2017 Senate Bill 2003 which created North Dakota Century Code (N.D.C.C.) § 15-10-62 which states as follows:

To promote national recognition and statewide enthusiasm, the legislative assembly encourages the university of North Dakota and the North Dakota state university of agriculture and applied science to play for the nickel trophy during the course of a national collegiate athletic association football game. If the athletic director or president of either institution elects not to play for the nickel trophy, the nickel trophy must be permanently displayed in the heritage center.

WHEREAS, neither institution has elected to play for, or display, the Nickel Trophy since enactment of N.D.C.C. § 15-10-62;

WHEREAS, the Blue Key Honor Society chapter for the University of North Dakota has since ceased to exist and its ownership interests vested in the University of North Dakota Student Senate;

THE PARTIES HEREBY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. The University of North Dakota Student Senate; Blue Key Honor Society, North Dakota State University chapter; University of North Dakota; North Dakota State University; and the North Dakota State Board of Higher Education (hereinafter collectively referred to as "donors") hereby irrevocably and unconditionally transfer to the State Historical Society all right, title, and

interest in and to the object previously described herein as the Nickel Trophy, including all owned copyrights, trademarks, and related interests.

- 2. Donors certify that, to the best of their knowledge, they are all possible lawful owners of said Nickel Trophy and that they are authorized to make this transfer of ownership.
- 3. Donors understand that by transfer of ownership of the Nickel Trophy, the Nickel Trophy becomes the property of the State of North Dakota, by and through its State Historical Society, and that the State may care for; preserve; display; dispose of; or transfer this object at its sole discretion as allowable by state law.

This Transfer Agreement shall be effective as of the date of the last signature of the

Representative Schneider,

You asked for information about the history of the Nickel Trophy up until the time it was given to the State Historical Society, how it came to be at the Historical Society, and any other information relative to the bill.

Sources credit University of North Dakota (UND) alum Robert Kunkel with the idea for the Nickel Trophy, which is an oversized replica of the United States Buffalo Nickel, designed by Dakota Territory-raised sculptor James Earle Fraser and circulated between 1913 and 1938. The trophy weighs 75 pounds, has a diameter of 22 inches, and is two inches thick.

North Dakota State University (NDSU) and UND first competed for the trophy in 1938, although their football rivalry dated back to 1894. The two teams, both members of the NCAA Division II North Central Conference since 1921, stopped competing for the trophy following their 2003 matchup as NDSU transferred to Division I the next year.

After the 2003 game, UND kept the trophy in various hidden locations following a history of prank thefts starting on the day of the trophy's unveiling and reemerging in the late 1990s in a series of elaborate plots led by UND and NDSU students.

When the two teams played one another in 2015, the trophy was no longer in play. Since their last match, UND had retired their "Fighting Sioux" nickname and logo; and the trophy, with a bison on one side and a Native American on the other side, no longer represented the mascots of each team.

On December 3, 2018, UND transferred the Nickel Trophy to the North Dakota State Historical Society, and in late 2020, the State Board of Higher Education formally approved the transfer.

The Legislative Assembly has considered legislation relating to the historical rivalry on several occasions (please see the legislative history materials linked below). In 2009, the Legislative Assembly failed to pass HB 1507 to require, and amended to encourage, an annual game between the two teams. In 2017, the Legislative Assembly passed language in section 7 of SB 2003 encouraging a renewed competition for the trophy or permanent display of the trophy in the Heritage Center. Through 2019 SCR 4011, the Legislative Assembly urged the student bodies of UND and NDSU to design and implement a new football rivalry trophy.

Both universities are now members of the Missouri Valley Football Conference.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15-10-62 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

15-10-62. Nickel Football trophy.

- After being retired by the university of North Dakota and the North Dakota state
 university of agriculture and applied science, the state-owned nickel trophy must be
 displayed permanently in the heritage center.
- 2. To promote national recognition and statewide enthusiasm, the legislative assembly encourages the university of North Dakota and the North Dakota state university of agriculture and applied science to play for the nickela state-owned trophy during the course of a national collegiate athletic association football game beginning with the football game in the fall of 2023.
