## Selected Bill Sections Recommended in the Executive Budget

Exemption - Posttraumatic stress disorder service dog program - Section 3 would provide the department an exemption to continue any unexpended 2021-23 biennium funds for the posttraumatic stress disorder service dogs program into the 2023-25 biennium. The Legislative Assembly appropriated $\$ 50,000$ from the general fund to the department for the program for the 2021-23 biennium.

Exemption - Federal State Fiscal Recovery Fund - Section 4 would provide the department an exemption to continue funding appropriated from the federal State Fiscal Recovery Fund for the 2021-23 biennium into the 2023-25 biennium. During the November 2021 special legislative session, the Legislative Assembly appropriated $\$ 647,000$ to the department for a grant to assist in the construction of the Fisher House at the Fargo Veterans Affairs Medical Center $(\$ 500,000)$ and to improve and expand veterans' medical transportation $(\$ 147,000)$.

## Continuing Appropriations

Veterans' aid fund - North Dakota Century Code Section 37-14-03.3 - The purpose of the veterans' aid fund is to make loans or advancements to any veteran and to a surviving spouse of a veteran if the spouse has not remarried.

## Deficiency Appropriations

There are no deficiency appropriations for this agency.

## Significant Audit Findings

The operational audit for the Department of Veterans' Affairs conducted by the State Auditor's office for the period ending June 30, 2020, identified the following audit finding:

Federal regulations not followed in grant agreement. Administrative costs totaling $\$ 3,051$ were directly charged to the highly rural transportation grant program. As identified in the audit report, indirect costs are not allowed to be charged directly to the grant and these costs should have been charged to the grant by a journal entry. The State Auditor's staff tested 16 grant subrecipient agreements and noted all agreements were missing information required by the federal government.

The State Auditor recommended the department comply with the grant agreement from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs and Title 2 of the Code of Federal Regulations part 200, which does not allow charging administration costs directly to the grant and using the appropriate indirect cost rate and updating subrecipient agreements to include required information. The department agreed with the recommendations.

## Major Related Legislation

House Bill No. 1157 - This bill appropriates one-time funding of $\$ 500,000$ from the general fund to the Department of Veterans' Affairs to provide a grant to assist in the construction of the Fisher House at the Fargo Veterans Affairs Medical Center.
House Bill No. 1182 - This bill creates a military honors funeral fund, provides a $\$ 200,000$ general fund appropriation to the Department of Veterans' Affairs to be transferred to the military honors funeral fund, and provides the Department of Veterans' Affairs a continuing appropriation from the fund to reimburse veterans' service organizations for providing funeral services at a military honors funeral.

## Selected Bill Sections Included in the First Chamber Version

Posttraumatic stress disorder service dog program - Section 3 provides the department an exemption to continue any unexpended 2019-21 biennium and 2021-23 biennium funds for the posttraumatic stress disorder service dog program into the 2023-25 biennium. The Legislative Assembly appropriated $\$ 50,000$ from the general fund to the department for the program for the 2019-21 biennium and $\$ 50,000$ from the general fund for the 2021-23 biennium.

Exemption - Federal State Fiscal Recovery Fund - Section 4 provides the department an exemption to continue funding appropriated from the federal State Fiscal Recovery Fund for the 2021-23 biennium into the 2023-25 biennium. During the November 2021 special legislative session, the Legislative Assembly appropriated $\$ 647,000$ to the department for a grant to assist in the construction of the Fisher House at the Fargo Veterans Affairs Medical Center $(\$ 500,000)$ and to improve and expand veterans' medical transportation $(\$ 147,000)$.

## Continuing Appropriations

Veterans' aid fund - North Dakota Century Code Section 37-14-03.3 - The purpose of the veterans' aid fund is to make loans or advancements to any veteran and to a surviving spouse of a veteran if the spouse has not remarried.

## Deficiency Appropriations

There are no deficiency appropriations for this agency.

## Significant Audit Findings

The operational audit for the Department of Veterans' Affairs conducted by the State Auditor's office for the period ending June 30, 2020, identified the following audit finding:
Federal regulations not followed in grant agreement. Administrative costs totaling $\$ 3,051$ were directly charged to the highly rural transportation grant program. As identified in the audit report, indirect costs are not allowed to be charged directly to the grant and these costs should have been charged to the grant by a journal entry. The State Auditor's staff tested 16 grant subrecipient agreements and noted all agreements were missing information required by the federal government.
The State Auditor recommended the department comply with the grant agreement from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs and Title 2 of the Code of Federal Regulations part 200, which does not allow charging administration costs directly to the grant and using the appropriate indirect cost rate and updating subrecipient agreements to include required information. The department agreed with the recommendations.

## Major Related Legislation

House Bill No. 1157 - This bill provides a one-time appropriation of $\$ 500,000$ from the general fund to the Department of Veterans' Affairs for providing a grant to assist in the construction of the Fisher House at the Fargo Veterans' Affairs Medical Center during the 2023-25 biennium. The 2021 Legislative Assembly appropriated $\$ 500,000$ from federal funds derived from the State Fiscal Recovery Fund for this purpose for the 2021-23 biennium, resulting in a total of $\$ 1$ million appropriated for the 2021-23 and 2023-25 bienniums.

House Bill No. 1182 - This bill provides a $\$ 135,000$ appropriation from the general fund to the Department of Veterans Affairs for providing reimbursement to a veterans' service organization that provides a funeral service at a military honors funeral.

Senate Bill No. 2204 - This bill allows National Guard members or surviving spouses to apply for a loan under the veterans aid loan program.

NDDVA is requesting additional DAV van funding of $\$ 18,800$ be added to $\$ 18,800$ (amount in the 20212023 budget) for a total of $\$ 37,600$ in the 2023-2025 biennium.

Current DAV Van inventory in ND is 9 vans serving the urban areas of:

- Bismarck (2 vans): Bismarck/Mandan, Jamestown, Valley City (communities between Bismarck and Fargo)
- Beach (1 van), Beach, Medora, Dickinson (communities between Beach and Fargo and Beach and SD Ft. Meade)
- Lidgerwood (1 van): Communities from Lidgerwood, Wahpeton and to Fargo
- Minot (1 van): Minot and communities along highway 2 and I29 to Fargo
- McHenry County (1 van): Communities along highway 75 to Jamestown and to Fargo
- Pembina Count (1 van): Communities along I29 to Fargo; Grand Forks, Hillsboro NDDVA's budget for vans:
- 2017-2019 included $\$ 37,200$ for the purchase of up to 2 transportation vans, no vans were purchased.
- 2019-2021 budget included: $\$ 18,800$, one (1) van was purchased at a cost to NDDVA of $\$ 13,845$.
- 2021-2023 budget includes $\$ 18,800$ for vans. 1 expected to be purchased 2023.
- It is estimated that two (2) vans will need replacement during the 2023-2025 biennium.

This funding along with funding from the DAV's Columbia Trust is used to purchase vans to transport veterans from across ND to the VAMC in Fargo. In working with the Columbia Trust NDDVA's has been able to purchase vans for $\$ 14,000-\$ 21,000$. When we submit applications to the Columbia-Trust we also
request that the trust consider North Dakota for a free van, the trust provides a few free vans nationwide each year. North Dakota received a free van in 2014 and again in 2018.

Once purchased the DAV Vans are donated to the Federal VA in Fargo. The Federal VA maintains all expenses for van to include fuel, maintenance, and licensing. Once van reaches its useful life it is returned to NDDVA for disposal. Useful life has been at 150,000 miles.

During the previous biennium ND Department of Veterans Affairs (NDDVA) experienced 30\% staff turnover. All staff turn-over was attributed to their salary/compensation amounts.

- Civilian, County and Federal employers are paying higher compensation packages.
- Four of our top candidates refused employment due to the compensation package NDDVA could offer.
- It is unacceptable that NDDVA cannot afford to recruit the qualified staff needed to serve North Dakota's Veterans. We need to provide funding to move these employees closer to a compensation package which is more reflective of the work that they are doing and competitive with the civilian, County and Federal employment markets
- In comparison to the top 3 competitors for NDDVA Veterans Benefit Specialist (VBS) positions NDDVA salary is on average $34 \%$ below. See below;
- MNDVA (23\%) Minnesota Department of Veterans Affairs poached one of NDDVA VBS at a starting annual salary of $\$ 12,000$ more than current salary of NDDVA VBS. That is a $23 \%$ higher wage. Source: MN DVA
- VARO ( $\mathbf{3 6 \%}$ ): Federal VA Regional Office Veterans Claims examiners grade 11 and 12 step 4 is $36 \%$ higher than NDDVA. Source: VA online pay schedule
- CVSO ND (44\%): County Veteran Service Officers (CVSO) of the top 8 largest counties in ND are paid on average $44 \%$ more than the NDDVA VBS who train and support them. Source 2022 Mill report.
- NDDVA VBS are also below ND Salary Market Mid-Point (MMP)
- ND Salary MMP (17\%): NDDVA VBS Grade 105 are on average $17 \%$ below MMP of the ND Salary Ranges for 2022-2023
- Total General Fund Salary Base for NDDVA 2021-2023 Biennium: $\$ 852,087$

- Budget at 77\% of base funding. Staffing at 60\%.
- Loss of two Full time Equivalent (FTE) staff members.
- FTE1: CL0033 Office Assist. III Position \#: 00003131 Vacant (Peggy Swisher)
- FTE2: CL0041 Admin Assist. I Position \#: 00003129 Joanne Rivera
- Loss of Temporary staff funding
- Highly Rural Transportation Grant (HRTG) coordinator (Laurie Vagts)
- Could result in additional Funding loss and/or 3rd FTE loss

The 2017-2019 budget begins July 1, 2017
We want you to be aware of the cuts and the changes.

NDDVA training events will need to be cut back to within our new budget restraints. Basically we do not have the funding for the four training events over the next 2 years. - 2017-2019 included $\$ 37,200$ for the purchase of up to 2 transportation vans, no vans were purchased.

- 2021-2023 budget includes $\$ 18,800$ for vans. 1 expected to be purchased 2023.

This funding along with funding from the DAV's Columbia Trust is used to purchase vans to transport veterans from across ND to the VAMC in Fargo. In working with the Columbia Trust NDDVA's has been able to purchase vans for $\$ 14,000-\$ 21,000$. When we submit applications to the Columbia-Trust we also request that the trust consider North Dakota for a free van, the trust provides a few free vans nationwide each year. North Dakota received a free van in 2014 and again in 2018.
Once purchased the DAV Vans are donated to the Federal VA in Fargo. The Federal VA maintains all expenses for van to include fuel, maintenance, and licensing. Once van reaches its useful life it is returned to NDDVA for disposal. Useful life has been at 150,000 miles.

During the previous biennium ND Department of Veterans Affairs (NDDVA) experienced 30\% staff turnover. All staff turn-over was attributed to their salary/compensation amounts.

- Civilian, County and Federal employers are paying higher compensation packages.
- Four of our top candidates refused employment due to the compensation package NDDVA could offer.
- It is unacceptable that NDDVA cannot afford to recruit the qualified staff needed to serve North Dakota's Veterans. ## VA to award $\$ 52.5$ million in grants to local organizations working to prevent Veteran suicide

WASHINGTON - Today, VA announced the availability of $\$ 52.5$ million in grants to community-based organizations that provide or coordinate suicide prevention services for Veterans and their families - including conducting Veteran mental health screenings, providing case management and peer support services, delivering emergency clinical services, reaching out to Veterans at risk of suicide, and more.

These grants will be awarded through VA's Staff Sergeant Parker Gordon Fox Suicide Prevention Grant Program. The Notice of Funding Opportunity provides information about the program, eligibility, and award process. Applications are due by 11:59 pm ET on May 19, 2023 and awards will be granted to eligible entities by Sept. 30, 2023. The funds will be used by the selected organizations in Fiscal Year 2024.

Preventing Veteran suicide is VA's top clinical priority and - as President Biden outlined in his State of the Union address - a key part of the Unity Agenda. In September, VA released the 2022 National Veteran Suicide Prevention Annual Report, which showed that Veteran suicides decreased in 2020 for the second year in a row, and that fewer Veterans died by suicide in 2020 than in any year since 2006.
"Veterans at risk of suicide deserve quick and easy access to mental health screenings, peer support, emergency services, and more - both from VA and community-based organizations," said VA Secretary Denis McDonough. "There are countless great organizations across America that are providing Veterans with this type of local, on-the-ground support, and we at VA are proud to support their efforts."

These grants are a core aspect of VA's 10-year National Strategy for Preventing Veteran Suicide and the Biden-Harris Administration's plan for Reducing Military and Veteran Suicide. This will be the second round of grants awarded as part of VA's Staff Sergeant Parker Gordon Fox Suicide Prevention Grant Program. In September 2022, VA awarded grants for the program's first year, totaling $\$ 52.5$ million to 80 awardees in 43 states, Washington, D.C., and American Samoa. The grant program is named after Parker Gordon Fox, a sniper instructor who died by suicide at the age of 25.

Grant funding will be divided into two priorities. Under Priority 1, VA will provide opportunities for funding to those entities with existing SSG Fox SPGP awards. Under Priority 2, new
organizations can apply for grants worth up to $\$ 750,000$. Following the selection of Priority 1 grantee applicants, any remaining funds will be awarded according to Priority 2. VA may prioritize the distribution of suicide prevention services grants under this Priority to: (i) Rural communities; (ii) Tribal lands; (iii) Territories of the United States; (iv) Medically underserved areas; (v) Areas with a high number or percentage of minority Veterans or women Veterans; and (vi) Areas with a high number or percentage of calls to the Veterans Crisis Line.

Over the past two years, VA has announced or continued several additional efforts to end Veteran suicide. In January, VA announced that Veterans in acute suicidal crisis can go to any VA or non-VA health care facility for emergency health care at no cost - including inpatient or crisis residential care for up to 30 days and outpatient care for up to 90 days. VA has also established 988 (then press 1) as a way for Veterans to quickly connect with caring, qualified crisis support 24/7; launched Mission Daybreak, a $\$ 20$ million grand challenge aimed at developing innovations to reduce Veteran suicides; conduced an ongoing public outreach effort on firearm suicide prevention and lethal means safety; and leveraged a national Veteran suicide prevention awareness campaign, "Don't Wait. Reach Out."
