Good afternoon, Mr. Chairman and members of the committee. I'm Matt Linneman, Deputy Director for Engineering for the North Dakota Department of Transportation (DOT). I'm here to introduce and support House Bill 1079.

House Bill 1079 will provide the DOT authority to enter into agreements with adjoining states and provinces to provide inspection and testing of fabricated products that are produced in North Dakota but will be incorporated into highway construction projects outside of North Dakota.

The DOT currently has contracts with Minnesota and South Dakota to provide inspection and testing services for certain fabricated products made in their states. These agreements provide significant benefit for the DOT as we get a high level of expertise at a very reasonable rate.
